DISCHARGE OF CHILDREN FROM RETTA DIXON HOMES.

In order to better serve the interests of children in our care, it is proposed in future to give more consideration to their ultimate placement upon discharge.

In some cases it is not necessary to seek placement as the children return to their parents or to their previous home. However, in some instances it has been found that children who turn 18 years of age and thereby cease to be State Children, have no home, accommodation or employment to go to and it becomes the responsibility of the Welfare Branch to assist them. It is these persons with whom I am at present concerned and would appreciate your co-operation in the proposal which is now submitted.

When you have considered this matter, I would appreciate your comments regarding the various aspects covered with suggested amendments or alterations regarding material which should be added or omitted from the report. Following receipt of comments from each of the hostels, a proforms will be prepared which will be made available to you on which reports should be made.

Following introduction of this method, these reports should reach me six months prior to the due date of discharge of any child from your hostel.
