- AIM feels strongly about the importance of protecting children from abuse.
- AIM is bound by, and acts in accordance with, all relevant legislation and will take into account other appropriate practices and guidelines aimed at the protection of children.
- No member of AIM staff is allowed to engage in conduct that constitutes violence, abuse, assault, sexual misconduct, harassment or other improper conduct as defined in Legislation and the Staff Code of Conduct for the Care and Protection of Children.
- AIM's policy and procedures are amended from time to time to take into account amendments to legislation and regulations.
