CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRAMMAR SCHOOL FOR GIRLS, NEWCASTLE

(Registered under the Bursary Endowment Act).

The School was founded by Ordinance of Synod in 1918.

The object of the School is to impart sound education in conformity with the faith of the Church, according to the use of the Church of England.

For several years students have been coached with marked success for the Intermediate, Leaving Certificate and University Matriculation examinations.

The School is situated at the corner of Newcomen and Church Streets, Newcastle, in a commanding position, and in close proximity to the Cathedral. Scholarships are advertised and awarded annually.

ST. JOHN'S COLLEGE, MORPETH

The College is now the property of the Diocese of Newcastle and is governed by a Council under the provisions of a Constitution created by Ordinance of this Diocese.

The aim of the Council is primarily to provide a Residential College in which students can be suitably trained and educated for the Sacred Ministry.

DIOCESAN HOMES FOR CHILDREN

The Church of England in the Diocese of Newcastle has undertaken a valuable and much-needed social work in providing homes for children who are in need of maintenance and careful training.

These Homes consist of:—

1. **St. Alban's Home for Boys, Cessnock.** This Home has been transferred from Mayfield to Cessnock following the policy of the Children's Homes Committee to decentralize the Homes. A new Home was erected at Cessnock and opened on 7th February, 1965, and accommodates 32 boys. The cost was £35,000 and the Home is in complete conformity with modern standards of child care.
2. **St. Elizabeth's Home for Girls, Singleton.** From June, 1926, until the end of 1942, "Winncourt," Mayfield, was used as a Diocesan Home for Girls. Owing to the fact that this property was situated in a very vulnerable war zone, the children were transferred to Singleton on the 12th December, 1942, where a very modern and well equipped building has been erected on land close to All Saints' Church.
3. **St. Christopher's Home for Little Children at Taree.** This new building was officially opened on the 18th March, 1956.

The Homes of the Diocese of Newcastle cost the Church approximately \$14,000 a year for feeding, clothing, nursing and tending the children. Subscriptions and donations are earnestly requested, marked for "The Bishop of Newcastle's Fund for the Children," P.O. Box 459, Newcastle. Tel. 2 1311.
