Philip: The intent would not be to use any names at all. There is no mention of it at all in the DC papers. In fact it does not even appear in the agenda. The Bishop would provide by way of description that we need to provide an ex-gratia payment of \$2K from the PSC budget in support of a Diocesan family who has suffered

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much pain. As the budget comes from the PSC budget it is clear what the subject is about. From an audit standpoint based upon the Ordinances, I must obtain DC approval. I have already spoken with the Bishop and I am sure that the issue will be dealt with in confidence and with sensitivity. Mac

Thankyou for indicating that the \$2000 recommended ex-gratia payment will be taken to DC on 14 Dec 06.

It's good that the matter is being progressed.

However I am a bit concerned that such a personal matter and one of such little magnitude has to go to DC which is a relatively big group of people.

My concerns are twofold.

Firstly, regarding the confidentiality and sensitivities at a personal level for the persons concerned i.e. the victims.

Secondly, I think it would be unfortunate if it got caught up in a political process - which DC can be - despite everyone's best intentions otherwise.

I ran my concerns by the PSC to see if, from a local perspective, my concerns are justified.

A response is set out below.

Is it possible for you and the Bishop, with the recommendation of the PSC to approve the payment from the Professional Standards budget without it going to DC/

Alternatively could any papers to DC be de-identified both as to places and persons?

Sorry to come back to you in this way but I am quite concerned for the potential impact on the family concerned.

I would not like to see the kind of statements which name the victim and involve third parties being widely distributed and I don't see why they need to be. Can Mac just ask for authorisation on our recommendation and say that we are working on wider

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issues which will be brought to the council if necessary (that's if it needs to go to council at all) . I don't see why anyone has to question our recommendation, just authorise the cheque - presuming that we have money left in our budget. Does the Bishop chair the council? Maybe he could be made party to our thinking. Ann
