Church of England North Coast Children's Home

Thank you for responding to my letter dated September 16, 2007.

I make comment on your letter dated September 18, 2007

With all due respect, contrary to what you have written, I need to bring to your attention that there are now only two abused victims. I essentially refer to my brother Richard 'Tommy' Campion and myself.

The other 39 victims settled their claim with a 'compassionate payment' a while back.

My letter to you was an official complaint to bring to your attention the intimidating manner in which I am treated.

The uncalled for assumptions on my morals only fuels ones disgust at the lengths taken to avoid what is the truth.

I have as I informed you, responded to Bishop Slater and I would like acknowledgement of those debilitating years, not the insensitive avoidance of the facts.

Not once have I personally been acknowledged for the unlawful existence under care in the form of a detailed apology.

Never once has the church shown an understanding of the issues.

You need to know the basis of denial was the church, "did not own the home, but may have had some sort of connection."

The church held the licence {Licence No32 under the Child Welfare Act - 1939} to own and run the North Coast Children's Home and that cannot be refuted now that we have obtained the documents of proof.

Why should I accept what the church says and walk away and not expect they work within their own protocols?

the church and public becoming so desensitized to the debilitating results of abuse that it becomes non-accountable?

In your letter to me you wrote: "I can assure you that I have done and continuing to do all I can to encourage the Diocese of Grafton to resolve this matter promptly with all due care and concern for you and the other persons. It is than of the utmost importance that the church responds to those persons with respect, sensitivity and pastoral care."

I thank you for those significant words. It would be pleasing for the Diocese of Grafton to follow your advice.
