RE: NORTH COAST CHILDRENS HOME & RICHARD "TOMMY" CAMPION

We enclose copy letter dated 2 August 2010 received from Messrs Gall Standfield & Smith Solicitors acting on behalf of Mr Campion.

As the letter accepts the changed wording to the Deed as sought by Bishop-in-Council we have included the new sub clause in the Deed enclosed. Mr Campion also asks for the inclusion of a sub clause referring to his own honesty in the dealings over this matter, we have also included this amendment.

Will you kindly advise whether these changes and the final draft of the Deed are acceptable and provide your instructions as to whether settlement is to progress on this basis.

The amounts now payable to or for Mr Campion are:-

• Settlement amount	\$22,658.54
• Interest 31/5/07 to 18/8/2010	\$ 5,222.70
• Lump sum future counselling	\$ 5,000.00
• Medicare (at present)	\$ 7,730.65

The amount for Medicare was correct as at their last advice to us in 2008, but this may increase. Mr Campion challenges this amount and appears to be having separate discussions with Medicare. Any queries over this amount will not hold up the proposed settlement as the amount owing to Medicare will be paid directly, and not through Mr Campion.

Attached to the letter from the solicitors acting for Mr Campion is an account for the independent legal advice provided to Mr Campion, will you attend to the payment direct of this account and advise when this has been attended to.

We note that the offer from the Bishop contained in his letter of 29 September 2008, which is guiding this settlement, refers to "a truthful apology." Will you kindly advise whether this apology has been provided to Mr Campion or whether it is to be forwarded as part of the settlement?

Should you instruct us to proceed to settlement we will immediately forward two copies of the deed to Mr Campion for signing on the understanding that when those signed Deeds are returned to us a cheque for the settlement monies due to him (\$32,881.33) will be forwarded to him. The two copies will then be executed by all the Releasers with one copy retained by the church and one returned to Mr Campion.

Would you kindly advise whether you have any instructions in respect to Mr Campion's sister.
