Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to advise you of certain allegations of child-related sexual abuse made against Mr Louis Daniels.

I am the Director of Professional Standards for the Anglican Diocese of Brisbane, and part of my role is to manage complaints of abuse against clergy and church workers. It is a policy of this Diocese that, when allegations of child-related sexual abuse are made, the allegations are reported to the police. I have also informed Sergeant [REDACTED] of Taskforce Argos [part of the Queensland Police Service] of the allegations. His contact number is 07 [REDACTED]

The allegations have not been made by [BYG] but by his aunt - [REDACTED]. Both [REDACTED] and [BYG] now live in Brisbane. The allegations have been made because [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is aware the [BYG] is still suffering long-term effects of the abuse.

Unfortunately, very little information is available, but I have been informed of the following.

Mr [BYG] [born in around 1972] was a member of the Church of England Boys Society [CEBS] in Tasmania in the 1980s when he was sexually abused by Daniels.

As you would be aware, Daniels was convicted in 2005 of a number of offences of sexual abuse and was sentenced to twelve months imprisonment. None of these offences related to [BYG] and it appears that [BYG] did not report the abuse to the police.
