Dear Father

On reflection, you may recall that some time ago, my wife REDACTED and myself, sought and obtained an appointment to discuss a very serious problem concerning our youngest son BTM, and Mr Billy (as you call him) Baker.

When I last contacted you in this matter you advised that no action has been taken to remove Mr Baker from community contact. Why that is so is probably only known to yourself, Archbishop Sir Frank Little, and God himself. I wonder what He thinks about the whole sorry mess. I am certain He would not be pleased with the underhand shoddy way victims are being treated or ignored. Father, it quite simply is not good enough. Anyone, without exception, who is involved in cover-ups or in transferring offenders in attempts to avoid responsibility is definitely culpable of any further offences, and I believe should be called upon to answer for his actions, or inactions in every proceeding offences. The buck must stop right there. Once reported, urgent investigation should be implemented by trained police investigators, and the person under investigation must be relieved of any duties which could place them in any position from which further offences could occur. That is surely plain common sense action, imperative to put a strong plug in the hole of disgusting immorality.

Quite obviously these horrendous crimes are in far greater proportion than the public know. The only way to go, in justice for victims is to act quite swiftly and ruthlessly. The victims and their loved ones are the people in physical and mental anguish deserving of all our compassion and help. I have not a shred of either compassion or sympathy for the offending monsters. I most certainly do for their innocent family or friends who were most probably ignorant of the crimes committed against the innocence of children.

Our son is still a very angry man whose emotions turn to rage whenever reflecting on his awful experience. If only BTM had come to us as a child and unburdened himself to us, how different his life could now have been. But his bitterness, disgust and hurt is something only God in His mercy can dispell. But as he no longer believes in God, he does not, and probably cannot pray.

Father do you, or does Archbishop Little intend to take any action in this instance? If not then we feel we must persue the matter further through different channels. Your reply would be appreciated.
