<b>ACT</b>	A person who is: a doctor; a dentist; a nurse; an enrolled nurse; a midwife; a teacher at a school; a psychologist, a person providing education to a child or young person who is registered, or provisionally registered, for home education under the <i>Education Act 2004</i> ; a police officer; a person employed to counsel children or young people at a school; a person caring for a child at a child care centre; a person coordinating or monitoring home-based care for a family day care scheme proprietor; a public servant who, in the course of employment as a public servant, works with, or provides services personally to, children and young people or families; the public advocate; an official visitor; a person who, in the course of the person's employment, has contact with or provides services to children, young people and their families and is prescribed by regulation.
