Good afternoon Alexis,

Just a few thoughts - matters for consideration to be included in plan. The Plan could include some specific directions.

1. Signed authority for PSO to communicate with therapist and current NSW GP.
2. Not to attend playgrounds where children or young people congregate unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
3. Not to go within 200 metres of a school.
4. Not to use social media for contact with children or young people.
5. Not to use the name Brother before his name, which may bring attention to him.
5. What are the requirements of the NSW Police regarding restrictions? Do they carry out a risk assessment when JC reports to them. (Agreement to be attached to JC file)
6. What are the requirements of the NSW Corrective Services JC has to comply with? (Agreement to be attached to JC file)

It would seem that even if the requirements of the Police and Corrective Services are loose, it is important that the Order's requirements should be even stricter.

There is the concern that he has trouble acknowledging that he is a perpetrator.
 JC did not participate in the Corrective Services therapeutic programs for sexual offenders in custody.
