

Randwick, but there is no full time French teaching position available at any of these schools. Br John Thompson indicated that there is a possible position of Yr 7/Yr 8 Coordinator available at Auburn in Term 4 1998. The position has been advertised and Br Ross if interested would need to apply in the usual manner. Br Peter Pemble is also interested in Br Ross going to Dundas as a French teacher. However this is dependent on some staff changes. The latter seemed the preferred option of the Council.

**Action:**

*Br Ernest Houston is to speak with Br Ross regarding the Coordinators position at Auburn in 1998.*

*Br. Mark Farrelly is to continue discussions with Br. Peter Pemble.*

**Br Dominic O'Sullivan.** Council considered the possibility of Br Dominic going to Dundas or Ashgrove. However the Principals at these two schools expressed some reservation about the appointment.

Br Dominic was considered for a posting to Lismore. Council considered that Br Dominic would be of great assistance to Br Neville Solomon particularly in the area of staff development. In response to a question as to whether a stipend would be available for Br Dominic, Br Mark Farrelly suggested that the Board at Lismore would have little problem with providing a stipend.

**Br Robert Hayes.** Br Peter Rodney reported that Br Robert feels under-utilised at Murgon. It appears that he does some work at school in the morning in assisting students with remedial reading and writing. He has tried to offer his services to teachers, however these seem not to have been taken up. Br Robert would suggest that unless there is meaningful work the Brothers should be withdrawn from Murgon. In particular, Br Robert is concerned about what a second Brother would do in the school in 1998 if he were not full-time in a classroom. Br Michael Green indicated that Br Robert tends to sell himself short in his work at the school. He is greatly appreciated by the school community and by the Parish. It appears that the Principal of the school would be open to providing a place for Br Robert in the school.

Council considered the Brothers presence in Murgon. It was felt that the Brothers presence is a significant contribution and would like it to continue as long as possible. There appears to be a great need for the Brothers presence in the school and among the youth of the Parish and district. Council considered the appointment of Br Darryl Slater to Murgon to work with youth.

**Action:**

*Br Mark Farrelly is to talk with Br Michael Hill regarding this possible placement of Br Darryl Slater at Murgon. Br Mark is also to contact Br Darryl sounding him out on the possibility of working with Aboriginal youth in and around Murgon.*

**Br Robert Love.** A temporary placement at Parramatta is now not possible due to the Principal's restructuring of the Staff Chaplain's role. Council considered the possibility of Br Robert moving to Westmead and working at the Westmead Children's' Hospital. He appears to be well qualified for this kind of work.
