Dear Paul,

Enclosed is a cheque for US \$5,000.00 which is the final payment. As you can recall in a letter to you dated April 23, 1996, the arrangement is that this is the final payment ~~that~~ in a series which was designed to still you for employment that would provide for your permanent support.

A meeting of legal advisers has considered your case, along with others. The meeting decided (suggested) that in view of the fact that you can never function in <sup>present</sup> ~~present~~ <sup>ministry</sup> ~~ministry~~ again, you <sup>in constant (or periodic)</sup> be invited to sign an application for naturalisation before this final payment. Realising such an arrangement was not a condition before the first of the payments, it cannot be enforced. However, in order to rectify your position you are encouraged to consider such a move.

The advisers are aware that the Diocese has spent over \$150,000.00 in supporting you and this situation which some claim is ~~at~~ scandalous cannot continue any further.

For your records and ~~to~~ ours this payment signals the end of the Diocese's support, we do not have any control over your actions or movements and have long ceased to be answerable.
