

Dunrobin Council Meeting. Bishop's Residence 15/6/1972.

The Lordship the Bishop presided. Present. Very Rev. Fr. Mcadden P. & Mgrs. Gleeson, Pasqualini, M. J. Inerney, M. McMahon, O. Brian, O. Ruffe, M. Kinnear.

1. Appointments. Parish Priest Limerick. Rev. J. Martin.

The Lordship reported that he had approached Father Martin as to act as Director of In-School Training.

2. The question of the number of priests on extended overseas leave was raised by the Bishop. After discussion it was decided that there should be no more than four on extended leave each year and that due notice of application should be made to the Bishop.

3. The Bishop suggested that he would write to Bishop Thomas of Geraldton to ask him to invite Mgr. Day to accept work in Geraldton.

4. A letter from Father Leo McCormack was read. He has been unsuccessful in his attempts to obtain an appointment in Ireland. In awaiting a medical report to submit to the Bishop of Lake Towns.

5. Sale of the "Corry Side" property Malceda. That it be sold to the Housing Commission. Moved Mgr. Pasqualini Sec. Mgr. O'Brien carried.

6. Sale of Land; Limerick.


8. Purchase of land adjoining the Hall at
