PROPERTIES: PENSURST: Fr. M. Delahanty, P.P. sought approval to sell the "Convent and land. Sisters of Mercy have no objections. Moved. Msgr. L. Biscalini, seconded Rev. P. Downs that permission be granted.

EDENHOPE: Fr. P. Claridge P.P. sought permission to sell the Presbytery and land and devote the monies to a new Presbytery project.
