

**MINUTES OF  
St Ann's Special School  
TaskForce meeting of 15/10/03**

Sue Cain summarised where procedures are at.

Issues:

1. Complexities of 'who' is managing finances, and therefore what is the best place to place the payment.
2. TF. Trust Account establishment in name of children is basic requirement for problematic cases.
3. DC. We need minimum amount of evidence required – then we will proceed. Emphasis on 'minimum'.
4. SC. [MA] Public Trustee has sent through documentations but [MA]'s personal documentation is missing eg. No Birth Certificate.  
  
TF. Just have physical identification that it is [MA]. There must be some document that shows that Public Trustee is appointed as such.
5. TF. HIC Issue  
Under Health Services and Other. Compensation Act must tell HIC that you are paying. This poses following questions.

Questions:

- Is Church a notifiable entity?
- Is payment in nature of compensation?
- Any liability associated with it?

TF. Told Brian Hayes about it.

Waiting on response from him as we want to process payments quickly.

If in doubt we contact HIC anyway.

6. [Family] Letter

DC. It is a problem for us. We are paying gift to 'live' victims.

Dilemma = can't pay to someone who is dead. To pay to [MX] = payment second party – would set a precedent.

One suggestion = payment in memorial of – money could go to a Charity. [NE] [NF] in grave need.

[NF] [N] had meeting with Archbishop. DC felt that this meeting was poor processing on our part.

Need to know what Archbishop said/promised.

[NE] [NF] situation has moved from lovely discussion re needs to letter of demands/threat.

= \$10,000/yr for 13 years or we will sue.
