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Problems With Br Gregory's Attitude to Rules and Procedures.

Children are not allowed to go to unsupervised areas without permission, Unless he is on supervision Br will not take any responsibility for enforcing this rule and is seen by children to be someone who will allow this rule to be broken.

Br Gregory has a habit of keeping a supply of tennis balls, and allowing children to come and borrow them without following playground procedures. He often has other attractions (e.g. loud music) which lead children to break playground rules to chat to him etc.

Although he has been asked to ensure children do not come to his area without permission, he has allowed children to do so repeatedly.

I have noticed that on occasions when he is aware of my presence his attitude to children in the wrong area is much more positive and professional.

Year Six teachers for the last two years have had added work to do on record cards because Br Gregory has not completed in part, or in full Record cards even though this is a regular task of the teacher throughout the year.

In disciplining a child Br has been heard to tell how he has or would deal with a particular matter. These suggestions are in direct contrast to the school's policy on discipline and Pastoral Care. The most recent incident I can recall was sometime in the last week of April when he told me that he had occasion to question a boy regarding an incident. He said that he told the child that if he didn't tell the truth he would "kick the shit out of him." He seemed rather proud of his handling of the matter. Another teacher remarked on the fact that he heard the child being reprimanded from his room
