

**Follow-up item to the meeting with [AYB] on 23 March 2002.**

1. I wrote to [REDACTED], letter posted on 25 March 2002.
2. Visit to [REDACTED] at 1.00pm on 26 March 2002 at her home. I informed [REDACTED] that the meeting had taken place in Brisbane between [AYB] and myself and that the impact of [REDACTED]'s letter to the Morning Bulletin was significantly upsetting. I informed [REDACTED] that there was much more to the claims of abuse than she was aware of. [REDACTED] was reluctant to believe, but she accepted what I was saying. She indicated she would not be taking any further action. It was an amicable meeting.
3. Meeting with M.D. on 26 March 2002 at his residence at 7.45pm. I informed MD of the meeting in Brisbane with [AYB], sharing the background of [AYB] and family distress over RD.

I made the request that he visit [REDACTED] to speak with her. He declined saying it would be like a hornet's nest and would not achieve much. He did not know the [REDACTED] family well, was involved infrequently.

I made the request that he meet with [AYB] and he declined saying nothing would be achieved except acrimony.

He spoke of RD's declining mental and physical health and his failing ability to cope with life. He mentioned the decision that RD had been judged fit to face trial and that an appeal had been lodged.
