

Follow up items to meeting with [REDACTED] AYB [REDACTED] . 23.3.2002

2. Visit to [REDACTED] . 1.00pm 26th Mar. 2002.
at her [REDACTED] ED .

I informed [REDACTED] ED that the meeting had taken place in
Bure, between [REDACTED] AYB and myself and that the impact
of [REDACTED] ED letter to the M.B. was significantly
upsetting. I informed [REDACTED] ED that there was much
more to the claims of abuse than she was
aware of. [REDACTED] ED was reluctant to believe
but she accepted what I was saying. She
indicated she would not be taking any
further actions.
It was an amicable meeting.

1. I wrote to [REDACTED] ED, letter posted on 25.3.2002
as per attached copy.

3. Meeting with Martin Durham 26/3/2002 at his
residence 7.45pm.

I informed M.D. of the meeting in Bure with [REDACTED] AYB
showing the background of [REDACTED] AYB and family
distress over R.D.

I made the request that he meet [REDACTED] ED
to speak with her. He declined saying it
would be like a hornets nest over which
not achieve much. He did not know the [REDACTED] ED
family well, was involved infrequently.

I made the request that he meet with [REDACTED] AYB
and he declined saying nothing would be achieved
except acrimony.

He spoke of R.D. declining mental and physical health
and his ability to cope with life.
He mentioned the decision that R.D. had been
judged fit to face trial and that an appeal
had been lodged.
