WELFARE REPORT.JR1 CJA

JR^{CJA} is a sensitive boy who has shown a great deal of interest in Chapel activities. In the first few weeks of R.E.A.S. LEEDWIN he was unhappy, but after a few friendly chats with him he seemed to settle down.

Following Christmas leave he was again unsettled, along with many others at that time. He came to the Chapel and expressed dissatisfaction with the Navy. Apparently at this time, he took no official action in requesting a discharge through the appropriate channels. As he did not raise this question again, we assumed he had made a satisfactory adjustment.

Recently JR^{CJA} has been unsettled by bad news from his father about financial difficulties. He has referred to his parents poor state of health, and feels that his presence at home is essential to enable him to assist his father in a new business which has recently been purchased. This latest development has further unsettled him, and he is extremely disturbed about his parents welfare financially and health wise.

The father apparently assumed that his son was certain to obtain a discharge following his "run". This, no doubt, precipitated his action in purchasing the self-service business.

Perhaps a fresh investigation of the current situation by a Welfare Officer might help in obtaining a clearer picture.
