Further to our telecon last night, I am able to confirm that during the *Societal & Legal* (S&L) instruction at *RAAF Wagga* in early January 2012, the class which I was leading covered extensively, and in depth, the issue of inappropriate relationships developing between cadets of any age, and IOC/OOCs, at any time. It is a topic that is always stressed at every S&L session that I conduct, always.

As we all know this is a critical area of trust and power balance within the AAFC which is similar to the teacher/student relationship, and one which the AAFC strives to implement and enforce.

The rationale and logic behind such a policy is well known and published repeatedly to the AAFC by the Commander, and earlier by me during my tenure as CDR-AAFC. As such, it is critical that all new recruit IOC/OOC be made aware, understand, comply and enforce this policy. There can be no exceptions.
