REASONS? (Describe specific behaviour and/or other factors):

On the night of the 23/2/88, BDA sexually interfered with a female foster child who was also in the care of the REDACTED. The REDACTED agreed to accommodate BDA overnight, but requested that our agency remove him from their care on the 24/2/88.

BDA is an angry, confused child who presented behavioural problems at the outset of his placement [14/10/87]. He has frequently displayed verbal aggression towards his foster parents [whom he perceives as having separated him from his family], jealousy toward other children in the foster home towards whom he has been physically aggressive, and difficulty playing co-operatively with his peers. More recently, BDA has presented self-destructive tendencies, e.g. trying to jump off a roof. Also his level of aggression towards younger children has increased. BFL BFM have offered BDA high quality care, especially in coping with his anger and aggression. BDA needs intensive help as regards coming to terms with his own family dynamics [i.e. rejection scapegoating] and is unlikely to have the capacity to fit into a family environment until this is attended to.

ALTERNATIVES TO CUSTODIAL CARE THAT HAVE BEEN EXPLORED:

Alternatives explored with L.N.A. Allambie. Options restricted due to the risk BDA may present with regard to younger children and the level of supervision he requires. Baltara was regarded as the only alternative for containment of BDA behaviour.
