

TURANA YOUTH TRAINING CENTRESECTIONSREMAND CENTRE (14 - 17 years)

Boys are held here before going to the Children's Court for their first appearance.

Second time remands are usually held in Quamby, or possibly in Poplar House.

CLASSIFICATION CENTREA (17 - 21 years)

At the discretion of the adult courts youths may be detained in Youth Training Centres. Following an assessment period of about three weeks, this group is classified and transferred to either Langi Kal Kal or Malmsbury

B (14 - 17 years)

Following admittal (wardship) or committal (sentence) boys take part in testing and interviewing for about three weeks before the Classification Committee meets to decide on future placement and training. Boys with fixed sentences go to either Bayswater or Morning Star, and wards move into one of the sections of the training centre of Turana.

TRAINING CENTRE1. GABLES (Open Section, 14 - 17 years)

- (a) Red: Up to 16, older wards or sentenced boys, usually transferrees from Poplar House shortly before release.
- (b) Blue and Green: About 20 wards in each section, generally first time admissions who come via the Classification Centre.
- (c) Sunnyside: About 20 wards who move from Quamby shortly before release. The building is separate from the other open sections and has larger indoor recreation areas.

2. QUAMBY/COOLIBAH (Medium security 14 - 17 years)

- (a) Quamby - wards of State in need of closer supervision. An average of 30 - 35 boys occupy this section.
- (b) Coolibah - about 20 - 25 difficult wards and short term sentence boys occupy this pre-release section which is unlocked during the day.
- (c) Poplar Cottage - is an open section for ten wards who attend school and also benefit from the privilege of a small section.

3. POPLAR HOUSE (Maximum security 14 - 17 years)

This section caters for about 20 boys who may be emotionally unstable or community risks. They receive constant supervision and assistance with their problems until ready to move to Coolibah or Red Gables.
