Investigation Outcome

I refer to our recent communications.


On 24 February 2012, the Western Australian College of Teaching ("the College") decided to take no further action with respect to the investigation of your conduct during the period 2001 to 2004, with respect to whether you took sufficient action to protect children from .

The College is very concerned that teachers take their duties of care towards children very seriously and are sufficiently proactive in protecting them. The College gave consideration to all of the facts and submissions surrounding the events, and has decided that your registration should remain intact and no further action be taken.

However, if in the future, the College was advised of any allegations of misconduct and/or any convictions, the new allegations and/or convictions would be considered together with situation investigated recently. The matter is regarded as finalised and the legal file will be closed. Provided no new allegations or criminal convictions arise, the matter will remain closed.

Notwithstanding the outcome of the investigation, we advise that should you make any application to teach in other Australian States or Territories under the *Mutual Recognition Act 1992*, or New Zealand under the *Trans Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997*, you are obliged to advise the regulating bodies in the other States of the investigation that has been conducted by the College. Therefore, we recommend that you retain a copy of this letter as evidence of the outcome of the investigation.
