I wish to apply for the position of English and History master as advertised in the "Courier-Mail" on Saturday July 8th 1972.

I am forty years of age, married and have three children; having graduated from Sydney Teachers College in 1954. For the past seven years I have been a member of the staff of St. Joseph's College Gregory Terrace.

Presently I am subject area moderator in History, being responsible for the teaching and assessment programmes from grade eight to Senior. Until being appointed History moderator in 1971 my teaching experience at Terrace had been mainly English and Economics to the fifth and sixth forms.
