

Tiles Hurlled At Attendants By Rioting Girls

Girls at the Parramatta Training School yesterday hurled roof tiles at attendants in the fifth riot at the institution this year.

Soon after 9 a.m., 12 barefooted girls climbed drainpipes to reach the roof of the three-storey building.

The girls shouted abuse at attendants.

Later, they abused two police officers and threw tiles at them.

There were struggles between attendants and four girls.

Other girls climbed down from the roof of their own accord. Some had been on the roof about 20 minutes.

The girls shouted at attendants and said they would demonstrate again if the police did not leave.

Attendants forcibly removed girls from other parts of the building.

About 25 girls, including some who had not taken part in the earlier disturbance, gathered in the courtyard.

They threw stones at attendants who were trying to catch them.

Attendants managed to lock most of the girls in ground-floor rooms.

The attendants then told policemen that order would be restored without their help.

about a full public inquiry into reasons why the girls continue to create disturbances."

The Minister for Child Welfare, Mr E. H. Hawkins, said last night that the authorities at the school were now considering what disciplinary action should be taken against the girls.

He said the situation was under control by noon, and that most of the girls had no part in the disturbance.
