

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The NSW Amateur Soccer Federation is committed to ensuring that the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children is maintained at all times during their participation in activities run by the NSWASF and its member bodies.

The NSW Amateur Soccer Federation, through the implementation of the Working With Children Check, aims to promote a safe environment for all children.

We are committed to assisting all staff, officials, coaches, trainers, managers, members and volunteers to recognise the signs of child abuse and neglect and to follow the approved guidelines as set down by the NSW Amateur Soccer Federation.

The focus of the NSW Amateur Soccer Federation Child Protection Guidelines is the prevention of child abuse in the sporting environment.

Administrators, coaches, managers, trainers and officials often have a high contact with children in the sporting environment and play a major part in the successful operation of sporting activities. These people are often seen as role models and have significant influence on children they come in contact with and therefore have significant responsibilities.

The NSW Amateur Soccer Federation expects all administrators, coaches, managers, trainers and officials whether paid or unpaid, who participate in organised sport under the NSWASF banner, to commit to implementing the strategies developed by the NSW Amateur Soccer Federation for child protection and intervention.
