Dear Headmaster,

In the official history "Character Unbounded" the chapter on Lawrence "Once the Mighty" contains several conclusions eg

- "Lawrence had begun the softening of the school culture, but his own character had proved susceptible to the temptations of his position" – page 133; and
- "Genuine regret for the fate of both Lawrence and his young charges ... combined with an absolute determination to obliterate any whisper of wrongdoing" – page 134

and so on, page 130 par 3; page 132 par 2; page 135 par 2, page 385 par, etc., etc.

Would Hutchins be able to assist me in any way in understanding and clarifying what these "conclusions" mean? What is the "evidence" for such conclusions etc?

Personally, I find ~~the~~ my request made of Hutchins, as above, pretty pointless but the Royal Commission has suggested that in the first instance, I make the approach and see, if anything worthwhile results in terms of explanation from Hutchins.
