do solemnly and sincerely declare


that, IN mid May 1998 I was given some information by Support worker Paul Major. This information was given to me innocently by Paul, as he had no idea of the issue at hand, during a weekly debriefing meeting with me.

Paul told me that fellow Support worker John O'Connor had told him that he had left a job in Melbourne due to accusations of child Abuse.

I didn't say anything to Paul about it but I spoke with Melissa Edwards as soon as I finished the meeting with Paul. Melissa asked me to repeat what I had been told to Manager Dorothy Williams. I did this and she responded by telling me not to say anything to anyone. That was the last I heard about the information I had passed on.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of the Oaths Act 1867
