Significant reforms to the Children's Court were also enacted.

The NSW Child Protection Council was an advisory body to the government consisting of senior representatives of a number of different government departments, together with community-based experts.

This led to the enactment of the *Community Services (Complaints, Appeals and Monitoring) Act 1993*.
