Dear EAG and EAE

I note with regret that you are withdrawing ^{CLC} from The King's School, effective immediately.

In the circumstances, the School will not pursue one term's fees in lieu of late notice. The Registrar's Office will contact you to finalise ^{CLC} departure from The King's School.

My understanding is that despite the dispensation above, you currently owe the School over \$30,000 in unpaid fees. I would ask that you liaise with the Bursar, Mr Geoff Dorman, to advise how and when these outstanding fees will be paid.

In relation to your many complaints detailed in your letter of 16 October 2013, the School does not accept it has acted in any way that has not been professional or appropriate.

As soon as the School learnt of the bullying problems suffered by ^{CLC} it took immediate measures, including investigating the matter thoroughly and obtaining advice from the Police. This resulted in the boy in question being removed from the School. When the School learnt of further bullying, we again acted immediately, investigated the matter carefully and suspended the two boys involved, even when you thought this action rather harsh.

Furthermore, immediate counselling was offered to ^{CLC} by Mr Greg James. In addition, his House Captain, relevant boarding staff and room buddy were all instructed to give ^{CLC} extra care and support. This they did, with you expressing particular appreciation for the care given to ^{CLC} by his room buddy.

All this, and more, bears testimony to a caring school that takes seriously its desire to protect the wellbeing of its boys.

I wish ^{CLC} well at his new school.
