Hi all,

Noel Callaghan has just rang me ( number **REDACTED**)

I then explained he must apply today because the notice issued by the CG requires him to have a clearance. I then went on to explain the ease in process including as a NSW driver licence holder, the proof of identity process.

He then explained he has a QLD licence because he lives in QLD at the moment but after the trip he will be coming back to NSW.

I gave him two options:

1. Apply today using his current proof of identity ( he indicated he may do this so that he can transfer his licence at the same time)
2. E-mail me and advise me that he is not currently living in NSW or working with Children but that he will apply when he returns.

I will forward any correspondence when I receive it. I also gave him the address for Tweed Heads service centre.
