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Projective Testing. (a) Holtzman Inkblots -

Results indicate a neurotic reaction with marked unconscious anxiety and aggression.

(b) Thematic Apperception Test -

This lad has a pretty strong system of psychological defences. Unconsciously he hates his younger sister - the one nearest to him in age - as the agent who separated him from his mother. He has a strong need for protection and shelter and has strong maternal dependence. He is anxious, insecure and lacks self confidence. The conflict with his younger sister is very important in his psychopathology especially as he is called on for expression of love towards her while subconsciously he hates her.

General Comments:

An intelligent lad, with a displacement syndrome manifesting itself largely in the form of bronchial asthma. This lad does need a means of working this through by a means such as play therapy. I would be pleased to assist with this case in any further way.
