Brother Ethelred has not had an easy task in trying to reconcile divergent opinions and the question of the United States' finding another centre for renewal will be raised in some fashion at the Provincials' Conference in May. The letters from overseas that had been tabled expressed the same ideas as those of Fr. Alman.

Br Provincial outlined the measures taken for the sale of the property at 89 Crown St. Sydney, valued at \$80,000, and for which a price of \$121,000 has been received. With the \$160,000 in reserve and the projected sale of the 40 acres at Campbelltown it may be possible to open the House of Studies at Marsfield free of debt. Br Kieran gave revised estimates of numbers at Marsfield 1972-76. The question of whether all the residential blocks are to be built at once is still to be decided.

Br Provincial outlined in detail the design of Bishop Stuyvenberg and his administration. More emphasis is to be given to primary education on the mission stations and Tenaru would become a secondary co-ed school catering for classes (single) of three forms: \overline{III} , \overline{IV} & \overline{V} . Auligo would be the feeder secondary school housing three classes
