



## Guide to Critical Incident Management

Many of our athletes, coaches and staff travel to national or international competitions, so it is important to be aware that should an unforeseen critical incident occur the NSWIS can assist with the following procedures. There are three categories that a critical incident will fall under.

A critical incident may include:

- A significant injury or death
- Natural disaster or act of terrorism

*What is your role if you are faced with a critical incident?*



### Three Categories of Critical Incident

#### 1. Category One

A direct critical event that has caused, or has the potential to cause serious physical and/or psychological harm to an athlete, coach or staff member. Examples of Category 1 events:

- death
- serious injury
- victim of a serious crime (rape, assault)
- act of terrorism or natural disaster

The NSWIS CEO must be contacted immediately. Staff member and CEO to discuss incident and priority order of contacts. Response to be discussed with CEO but could include immediate flights from location, support staff sent to location, immediate media comment.

#### 2. Category Two

A direct or indirect critical event that has caused, or has the potential to cause significant physical and/or psychological harm to an athlete, coach or staff member. Examples of Category 2 events:

- Significant injury requiring hospitalisation
- Significant injury that may end an athlete's career
- Witness to Category 1

The NSWIS CEO or another manager may be contacted to discuss an appropriate response.

#### 3. Category Three

A critical event that has the potential to cause physical and/or psychological harm to an athlete, coach or member of staff. Examples of Category 3 events:

- Injury that may end an athlete's tournament
- Alleged positive drug test

- Alleged perpetrator of crime

Relevant staff contacted as soon as practical. CEO briefed within 48 hours. Response could include a debrief session, access to psychology staff and support of the family.

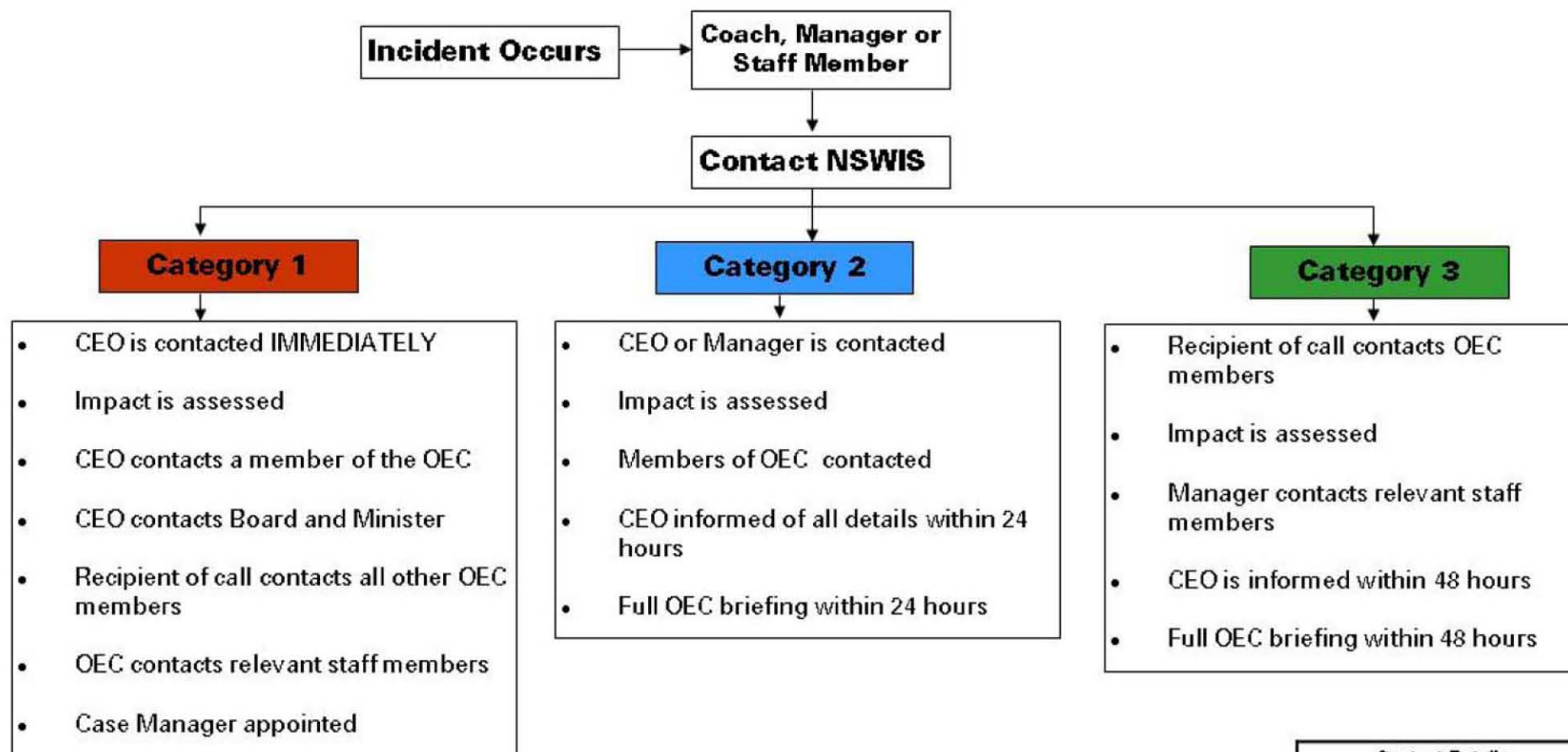

**Category 1** = Death, serious injury, victim of a serious crime, act of terrorism or natural disaster  
**Category 2** = Significant injury requiring hospitalisation, significant injury that may end an athlete's career, Witness to category 1  
**Category 3** = Injury that may end an athlete's tournament, alleged positive drug test, alleged perpetrator of crime
