JIRT officers D/S/C Sarah NORRIS and Senior Caseworker Wendy Warburton attended the home of CIE at REDACTED at 10.30am on 2 April 2012 for the purpose of a second JIRT interview. Both parents were initially present when workers arrived and then father CIG left for work matters and REDACTED stayed to assist CIE during the interview. CIE appeared less tired than he had done the week before and REDACTED confirmed that he had slept well the previous evening and she had not told him we were coming back until this morning. The second interview with CIE was electronically recorded using two portable video cameras and a hand held digital recorder (RO226768). CIE was not able to give permission for the interview to be recorded due to his disability. As he is completely non-verbal, the interview with CIE was conducted initially using the QWERTY keyboard held by his REDACTED as well as a yes/no/don't know sheet prepared by CW. The QWERTY keyboard is a cardboard sheet with letter and numbers set out as a computer keyboard is. CIE uses the board held by his REDACTED to point spell what he wants to say. This method of communication is what CIE is used to and is quicker than his computer. After CIE took a short break, the remaining questions were asked using his desk top computer keyboard. Notes taken during the interview and the printout from his computer are attached to this record.

The questions asked and CIE's answers from the first interview were read out by OIC D/S/C Norris at commencement of the interview. Using the yes/no/don't know sheet CIE was asked again about truth and lies and when asked if it would be a lie if someone said we were not at his home at the present time he indicated YES on the sheet by pointing his finger at the word. CIE was then asked if he would only tell the truth during the interview and again indicated YES. CIE was then asked about his answer during the previous interview where he said that Royce had tried to touch his penis. CIE was asked if Royce had actually touched his penis and he pointed to YES on the sheet. CIE was asked if Royce had touched the skin on his



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penis and he pointed to YES again. CIE was asked if this touching was over the top of his clothes and he pointed to NO.

CIE was asked where he was when Royce touching his penis and using the cardboard QWERTY board held by his [REDACTED] he spelt 'the toilet' and then - 'holiday care and afternoon care'. CIE was asked if there was anyone else there and spelt No. He then point spelt "felt it got dangerous - he took harried satisfaction i n touching my penis". CIE was asked if Royce said anything when he did that and he spelt - 'many times' then 'everytime he said a hurt. Feel I feel I mog".

CIE was asked if he likes Royce and point spelt 'like good safe person" CIE was asked what Royce did after he touched him on the penis and he replied "he looks for erection from me". CIE was asked if Royce had asked him to touch his penis and responded 'yes lots'. CIE was asked what happened the last time that he saw Royce and he responded that they 'went bike riding'. CIE was asked if Royce had touched his penis that time and answered 'no'. CIE then point spelt 'Go Royce to damnation'. CIE was asked if Royce had pulled his pants down and he said 'no'. He was then asked if he had pulled his own pants down and said 'yes' when asked why he said 'toileting'. CIE was asked if his mum and dad are the only people that he has told about Royce and answered 'yes' by pointing at the chart.

CIE had a short break at this point (12.15pm) and when he returned to the room it was decided to try the last few questions on his computer keyboard which was then saved to thumb drive and printed (see attached). The questions and answers given by CIE follow:

1. How old were you the first time Royce touched your penis? (a) - 14
2. How old were you the last time Royce touched your penis? (a) - 15
3. Did you actually touch Royce's penis? - (a) Can say treated him as nerd wantedlike Royce dread being same as him. He realmade me go wqued to great free sex hurt. (CIE was asked this question 3 times and touched the chart in the middle between yes and no each time there by avoiding the question)
4. What could you feel physically when you touched Royce's penis? - question not asked due to no clear response to above question.
5. Where were you when this happened? not asked.
6. Has everything you have told us today been the truth? (a) Truth yes.

The interview with CIE was concluded at that point as his attention span was waning. [REDACTED] was spoken to after the interview and was advised that all the information gathered during the interviews would be reviewed by police team leader and Manager Casework and some discussion would be held around what action is required from here. Counselling options discussed. CIE advised that her husband CIG has been actively seeking information on counselors available and they are considering using a paster in their Church who told them he is experienced in this area. The Church is called Victory in Bomaderry. CW advised that I would discuss the case with Links House in Nowra to see what service is best placed to provide counselling for CIE given his degree of disability.
