JIRT officers D/S/C Sarah NORRIS and Senior Caseworker Wendy Warburton attended the family home of CIE - REDACTED on Friday 30 March 2012 at 11.15am as arranged. Parents of CIE, CIF and CIG were spoken to separately before the JIRT interview with CIE (see attached notes). Parents provided the following information.

- The family has been accessing support through Interchange and Disability Trust for about 3 years. They first met Royce (they do not know surname) over a year ago. They used to access the support for two hours periods on Thursday and Friday initially and this was later changed to Tuesday afternoon for two hours. CIF advised that this arrangement did not suit them and she asked repeatedly why it had been changed to Tuesdays. CIF said that Interchange had been seeking more male workers and they were happy to have more male influence for CIE as his father CIG is the only male close to him. The respite used to take the form of two hourly sessions outside the home with CIE being taken for bike rides. He also attended the holiday care programme and had contact with Royce there.

CIF talked about an incident that occurred where a male carer Rod bumped CIE's bike on the track and he 'lost it' for about 15 minutes. It took CIE about 15 minutes to calm down and a lady (NFI) gave him some homeopathic remedy called 'Rescue' with some water. There were never any really problem issues during the time he was accessing this service. CIF said that Interchange had been seeking some new workers and a person called Angelina told her that a carer called Royce had wanted to meet CIE and was keen to work with him. After they got to know him a bit CIF saw CIE give Royce 'funny looks' but didn't think a lot of it at the time. Royce told them at one point that he wanted to build a relationship with Royce also told them that he 'was tough and he gets results'. On the 20 March 2012 they left for their usual bike ride on the Tuesday and then came back half an hour early which was unusual. Royce told them that CIE had got to a certain point and then just turned around and came



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back. [REDACTED] CIF could hear CIE [REDACTED] and making a "uhh" noise that means he is distressed. When Royce left she got the keyboard and that is when he told RE that [REDACTED] has to come with him next time. When asked why he said that it was because Royce touches his willy. It was clarified with CIF that CIE did say that he did not tell [REDACTED] earlier because he thought it was his fault because he got aroused (CIE's words). CIE also said to [REDACTED] that "the man has form - from many times before". CIF provided a hand written account of what CIE had said that to RE that day - 20/3 and further conversation two days later on the 22/3 (see attached documents). Also attached is typed documents provided by CIF who advised JIRT officers that [REDACTED] had typed up other information relating to the incident on his computer keyboard and she had printed this off. CIF also provided other samples (letter to parents - see attached) to give examples of CIE's literacy levels. CIE is attending [REDACTED] High School after much pushing from them and he is undertaking Year 9 curriculum.

CIF was asked about CIE's toileting needs and said that he takes himself to the toilet and does not need any help with his clothes or to use the toilet. CIE sits down to urinate. He wipes his own bottom although sometimes not very effectively. He does not call for help with this and she just cleans up afterwards. There is no reason for another person to be in the cubicle with CIE when he is at school or other disability service that he attends. CIE was diagnosed with Autistic Spectrum Disorder at the age of three. That is the only diagnosis and he is not currently medicated. CIE sleeps all night usually and has a good appetite. JIRT process discussed and what information we will need to obtain from [REDACTED] independently. [REDACTED] to remain present but will not prompt CIE in any way. CIF said that CIE has been very anxious and did not sleep well last night. He has also attended school this morning and is quite tired. CW advised that we will begin interview and if he gets too tired or cannot continue we will come back another day.
