Call to Leah Phillips ADHC Psychologist Nowra. Leah said that she has only met CIE and the family on two occasions. The referral was part of his eligibility to access service through ADHC and when the disclosure was made it was decided that she would do a home visit to offer support to the parents who were struggling to deal with the disclosure from CIE. Leah said that when she visited CIE was quite OK and was engaging and curious. He did his own thing but was obviously interested in his parents conversation with her. Leah did not see him display and anxiety or agitation all during her visit. Leah thought from his facial expressions that there was some degree of understanding in what was going on around him. Leah said that she noted that REDACTED CIE got quite impatient with CIE when he got distracted quickly. CIE's response to his REDACTED was to become very frustrated and get up and walk away. Leah said that CIE paces the room a lot as does his REDACTED when she is feeling anxious. Leah said that CIE really enjoys his trampoline and this may be something that can be used to keep him focused. Leah does not think that CIE would become violent within his home environment and his REDACTED is good at redirecting him and keeping him on track. Leah also suggests that interviewers are very patient and give clear instructions to him. Leah has not seen him communicate via his keyboard. Leah describes REDACTED CIE as quite concrete and literal in her thinking but very appropriate with him. Dad is more chilled and has a realistic view of what CIE is capable of. If matter is unable to proceed to court Leah thinks that both parents would be OK with this and just want their son to be heard and believed and have access to services.
