do solemnly and sincerely declare⁽²⁾ on 9.9.1975 at approx. 1210hrs I was asked to examine a girl, identified to me as being AJW born 11.3.1968. HRN 60868

Allegedly she was sexually assaulted by an adult male some time back (at least 12 days).

On examination no lesions were found in the ano-genital region. The hymenal opening was rather large but even, un-interrupted and no discharge from either vagina or anus was observed.

A specimen for bacteriological examination was taken.

and I further declare that I -

- (i) have reached the age of 18yrs
- (ii) I have read this statement.

And I make this solemn declaration by virtue of the *Statutory Declarations Act* 1959-1966, and subject to the penalties provided by that Act for the making of false statements in statutory declarations, conscientiously believing the statements contained in this declaration to be true in every particular.

NOTE 1—A person who wilfully makes a false statement in a statutory declaration under the *Statutory Declarations Act* 1959-1966 is guilty of an offence against that Act, the punishment for which is a fine not exceeding \$200 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or both if the offence is prosecuted summarily, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding four years if the offence is prosecuted upon indictment.

NOTE 2—A statutory declaration under the *Statutory Declarations Act* 1959-1966 may be made only before a Chief, Police, Stipendiary, Resident or Special Magistrate, a Justice of the Peace, a person authorised under the law of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory to take Affidavits, a person appointed under the *Statutory Declarations Act* of the Commonwealth or under a State Act to be a Commissioner for Declarations, a Notary Public, a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the law of the State in which a declaration is made, or a person appointed to hold or act in the office of Australian Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, Trade Commissioner, Consular Agent, Ambassador, High Commissioner, Minister, Head of Mission, Commissioner, Charge d' Affaires, Counsellor, Secretary or Attache at an Embassy, High Commissioner's office, Legation or other post in a country or place outside Australia.
