

# The Photography Club

The Marist Photography Club was run as an extra-curricular activity on Monday afternoons for the senior group and on Wednesday afternoons for the junior group. Students from Saint Clare's also participated in the course with the boys on their specified afternoons. Students were taught the basic methods of photography and darkroom developing in the junior photography group, which included students from Years 9 and 10. In the senior photography group, where there were students from Years 11 and 12, the emphasis was on private project work and the refining of each student's skills.

This year the Photography Club moved its operations into a photography darkroom in the new Expressive Arts Department building. This room is well equipped with safety lights, ventilation, water and ten enlargers. There is also room for colour photography.

The course itself offers tuition by Brother Kostka, a very accomplished and experienced photographer. Students are taught how to use their own particular

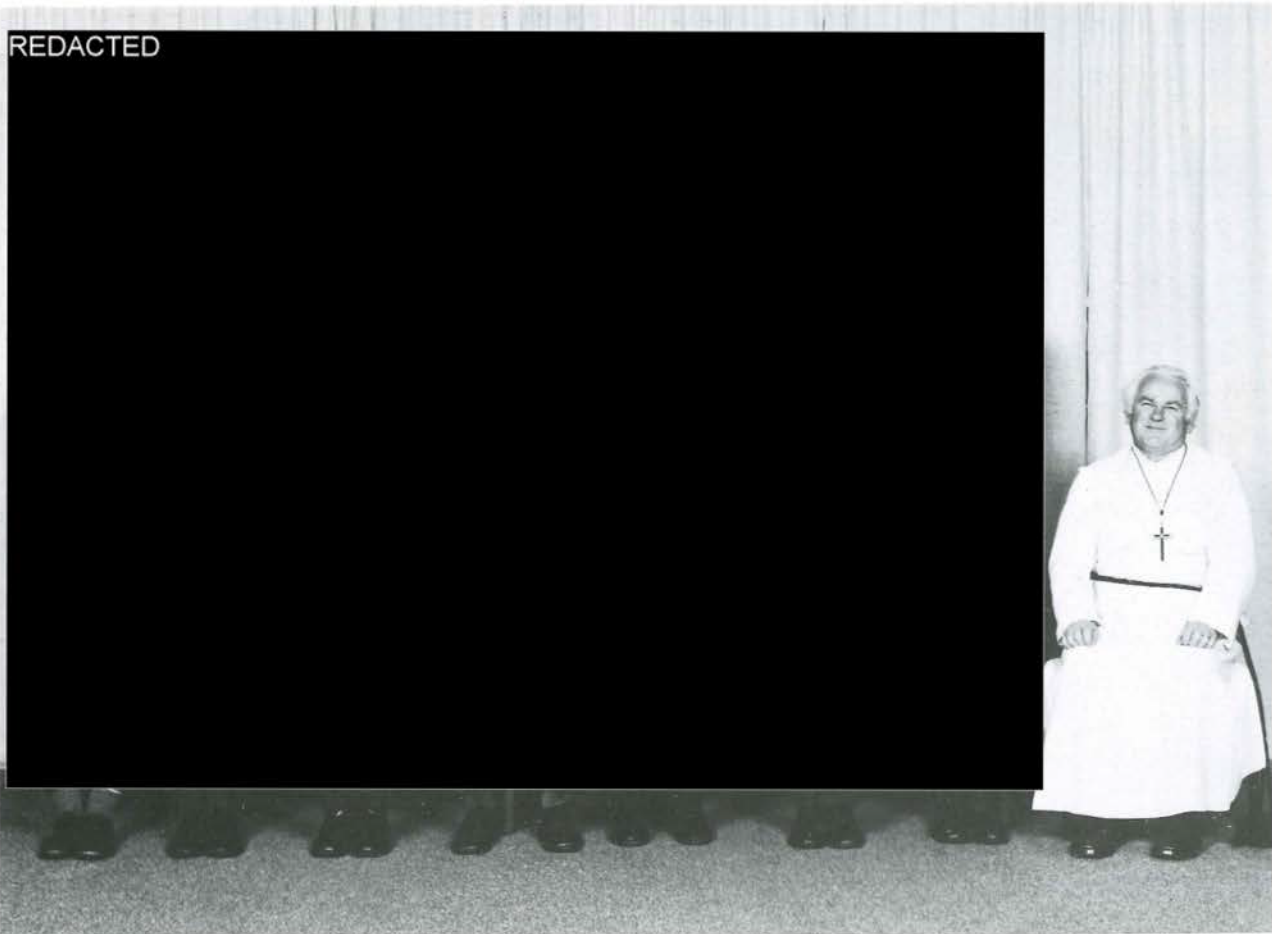
camera, lens and films and how to take many different types of photographs. These may include outdoor and indoor action, scenic and portrait photography.
