PURPOSE, NATURE AND EFFECT OF CAUTION:

- A caution gives you a further chance not to break the law again.
- A caution is a warning given to you by a "police officer/respected Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander person from your community."
- A caution is given to you "instead of placing you before court/at the direction of the Children's Court."
- Once you have received a caution the matter is finished and you do not have to go to court for this offence.
- The caution is not part of your criminal history.
- If you break the law again you may end up having to go to court.
- The *Juvenile Justice Act 1992* requires that once you have been given a caution you must be provided with a **NOTICE OF CAUTION**.
- You should keep this **NOTICE OF CAUTION** as proof of you having been cautioned for this offence.

You are not required by law to sign the acknowledgment.
