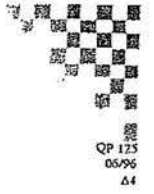

ADDENDUM STATEMENT:

AEE States;

1. I provided a statement to Police in relation to this matter on the 1st day of July 2004 and a further statement on the 19th day of August 2004.
2. Today, Thursday the 21st of October 2004 I attended the office of Task Force Argos where I have had a further conversation with detective Leon REINKE.
3. At this time Detective REINKE has shown me a copy of the Pan Pacific Selection Trials program. The program is titled, "1999 Telstra Australian Open Championship. Pan Pacific Championships Selection Trials. Program of events".
4. I recognise this program as a record of the events held at that meet. This program indicates that the first day of these trials was Saturday the 20th of March 1999. The program then indicates that the women's 100 metre REDACTED heat was event nine on Day 2 of the trials, Sunday the 21st day of March 1999. It also indicates that the heat was held in the morning and semi final that same night. The program indicates that the final was held on day 3, Monday the 22nd day of March 1999 at night.
5. The program also indicates that the women's 200 metre REDACTED was held on day 5, Wednesday the 24th of March 1999 with the heats in the morning and semi finals on that



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same night. The program indicates that the final was held on day 6, Thursday the 25th of March 1999. On seeing this program I believe it to be accurate, one reason for this is that I now remember that the men's 100 REDACTE is always the day before the women's.

I am able to identify the program titled, "1999 Telstra Australian Open Championship. Pan Pacific Championships Selection Trials. Program of events" shown to me by detective REINKE.

6. Detective REINKE has also shown me a document titled the 'Pan Pacific Championship Selection Trials' at Chandler Aquatic Centre, Brisbane, Queensland 20th – 23rd March 1999. This document shows all the swimmers who competed at these trials. It indicates that I swam in the 100 metre REDACTED heat and semi final and that I swam in the 200 metre REDACTED heat, semi final and final. This appears accurate to myself and an accurate representation of when and how I swam.

I am able to identify this document titled the 'Pan Pacific Championship Selection Trials' at Chandler Aquatic Centre, Brisbane, Queensland 20th – 23rd March 1999' shown to me by detective REINKE.

7. I had originally thought that I was assaulted by Scott VOLKERS the day before my 100 metre REDACTE and that this was on the first day of the trials.
8. I recall that I was training at Sommerville House on the day before these trials started. I can remember that I went to training at Sommerville House on the morning before the trials started. It was at that training session that he asked me to go to his house where he assaulted me as I have mentioned in my other statements. I did not go to training at Sommerville House that afternoon.
9. On seeing the program of events for this meet, I realise that Scott VOLKERS did not assault me the day before my 100 metre REDACTE event and that there was a day between training at Sommerville House, which was the day before the trials, and my 100 metre REDACTED

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10. I think this is because, basically because every day of the meet I went to the pool, I did the same warm up every day trying to get my stroke together by myself without my coach. I think I probably thought that because basically, for me, my 100 metre REDACTED was the first day of the meet because it was my main event and the start of racing for me.

11. Every day during the meet that I wasn't competing, I went to the racing pool at Chandler and did my race warm up, trying to get my stroke together. On the first day of the trials, the program indicates that I did not have an event the first day. On this day I would have gone to Chandler and done my race warm ups, I remember doing them in the 25 metre pool. I basically did my own warm ups. I understand why I believed that it happened to me before my first race, and that was because for me, my first event was my first day. That whole week Scott wasn't helping me.

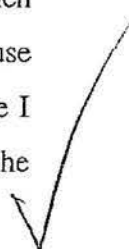
12. I still remember that my mother asked me to pull out of the meet the night of the day I went to Scott's.

13. I used to keep a swimming diary. I recall that I had a diary that I recorded training sessions and how I felt in the water during the time that I trained with Scott. I recall that I had one for the Pan Pacific selection Trials in 1999. I have already looked but I don't have personal comments about the day before the trials because I take the diary to public areas and didn't want people reading it. I may have something in there about the first day of the trials and when my events were. I still have possession of the diary somewhere at home.

14. At training the day before the trials, no one was around when he asked me to go to his house. That afternoon when I did not go to training I have already mentioned that Sam RILEY, Susie O'NEIL, Jasmine GEISEL and Casey FLOUCH should have been there.

15. I do not wish to alter any thing else with regards to my statement given on the 19th of August 2004 however I have also spoken briefly to REDACTED about Scott VOLKERS. When the media contacted me this year I was unsure of what to do so I contacted REDACTE because she had gone through the same thing with Scott. This was only within a few days before I came to the Police about this matter. I told her who I was, that I trained under Scott, that the

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media had contacted me and that Scott had done something to me. I didn't go into great detail. I had I conversation in relation to the media and what would happen.
