Vision cannot be improved as a result of a corneal scar.

L eye vision cannot be improved. Very little refractive error. This eye was treated 3 years ago by Dr Whaites by occluding the R eye. No improvement in vision resulted so it must be presumed that no improvement can be obtained. R eye has no refractive error and above average vision.

R vision less than 6/60 will improve to 6/60 with R -7.50 -2.00 x 130. L eye has no refractive error. As the corrected vision is poor and the difference in image size as a result of the large refractive difference would make binocular vision impossible, so little good would come from correction.

Vision R & L appears to be about 6/60 or a little better. This girl was difficult to make any contact with as she appears to be extremely timid. I suggest that she is sent in at another time convenient in the next few weeks so that we can gain her confidence. She has some lid anomaly which should be referred for Medical opinion.
