This 18 year old girl with Noonan's Syndrome continues to become distressed re the issue of her suspected sexual molestation. It is a major problem in her life affecting her relationships with family and friends, her schooling and education, etc.

She is physically frail with severe epileptic seizures and until recently severe recurrent tonsillitis. Her epilepsy takes the form of uncontrolled tonic/clonic seizures and often Status Epilepticus. She can also suffer "drop attacks", parietal epilepsy where what small amount of vision she has disappears (these often require rectal valium) and more recently frontal epilepsy where she has sudden mood changes to become very aggressive. There is now a proven hearing loss caused by anti-biotics at the time of her tonsillectomy and a worry that she is developing Endometriosis with significant period pains.

Support from extended family is extremely limited because of the severe epilepsy and the need for administering rectal valium for Status Epilepticus. Emergency hospital admission and resuscitation often follows. Mrs. Welch relies on approximately 4 hours of respite weekly which is not enough support for the patient and family. They urgently require assistance of a physical as well as psychological nature
