## BOYS REMANDED TO THE CARE OF THE DIRECTOR OF CHILD WELFARE

On Monday, 22nd. March, 1965, the Welfare Officer was approached by Senior Constable Grant, of Pine Creek, with a request for assistance in finding overnight accommodation for four boys, aged 12,13,13 and 14 years, all of Darwin, who were to appear before the court in Katherine that afternoon on a charge of Illegal Use of a Vehicle.

2. The boys subsequently appeared before Messrs. Ryan and Pascoe, Justices of the Peace, and were remanded to the care of the Director of Child Welfare, until 10 a.m. Wednesday, 24th. March, when they are to appear before the court in Darwin.

4. REDACTED and REDACT are boys from Retta Dixon Home.
REDACTE lives with his parents at 61 Stuart Highway, Darwin.

- 5. The boys were given overnight accommodation at the Welfare Officer's home. Here, after a period of reserve, they quite voluntarily initiated a discussion of their reasons for leaving Retta Dixon Home.
- 6. Among other things they alleged that their cottage—
  "father", Mr. Pound, fefers to them as "half-blackfellows" and
  says that he will "knock Satan, and the black-fellow, out of them";
  that he redicules their mothers as women-of-the-town in front
  of other people; that he beats younger children after stuffing
  their mouths with rag so that their cries can nor be heard and
  then locks them in a small cupboard; that he force-fed a young
  child named Sandra, by holding her head backwards under a tap
  and banging her head down backwards on cement. Apparently this
  child has since died, of a supposed brain-tumor. The boys claim
  they are not allowed access to Mr. Pattimore with their grievances
  as has always been the rule, but are threatened, and afterwards
  punished, if they approach him.
- 7. Even allowing for school-boy exaggeration to what they must have considered a sympathetic audience, it does seem possible that there might be some aspects of conditions in this particular cottage at Retta Dixon, that could bear some investigation by the correct authorities.
