Data analysis of claims and substantiated complaints in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne

Data report

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Scope of Analysis

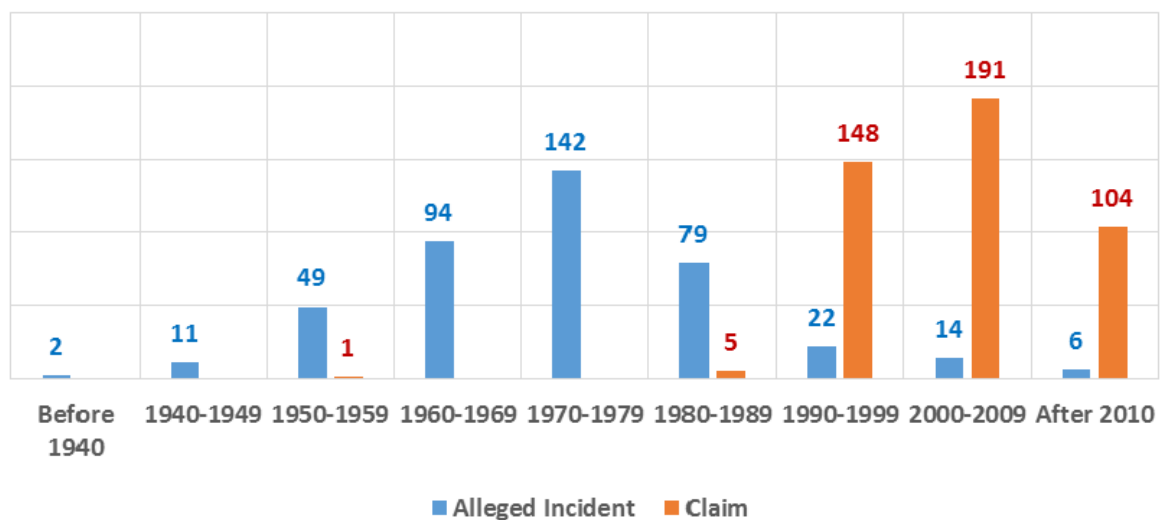
1. The Royal Commission has conducted a comprehensive data survey of all Catholic Church authorities in Australia including the Archdiocese of Melbourne.
2. The data presented in this document relates only to claims or substantiated complaints that have been received by the Archdiocese of Melbourne that relate to a person subject to a claim and/or substantiated complaint (an accused) operating within the Archdiocese at the time of the alleged child sexual abuse.
3. The comprehensive data survey sought all claims and substantiated complaints that were received by the Archdiocese of Melbourne during the period 1 January 1980 to 28 February 2015.
4. A claim of child sexual abuse against Catholic Church personnel is made when a victim, or their solicitor or advocate seeks redress on their behalf through Towards Healing, the Melbourne Response or another redress process, including civil proceedings.
5. A substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse is a complaint made by any person against Catholic Church personnel that is substantiated as a result of an acceptance or investigation by the relevant Catholic Church authority.

Information pertaining to all claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne

6. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 454 people made either a claim of child sexual abuse or a complaint of child sexual abuse that was substantiated, in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne.
7. Five of these claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne had more than one accused.
8. The data indicated that the gender of the people who have made either a claim or substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne (where the gender is reported) was 72% male and 28% female. The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was 10 years old for females and 11 years old for males.
9. Where the age of the claimant or subject of the substantiated complaint is reported, 71% were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 29% were 13 years or older.
10. Eighty-eight per cent of the claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne related to incidents alleged to have occurred in the period from 1950 to 1989 (inclusive).

11. The decade with the highest number of alleged incidents of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne was the 1970s, with 142 claims or 34% of the total claims or substantiated complaints relating to this time period.
12. The chart below shows the number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne by the year of the alleged incident and the year of claim where relevant dates are known.

Year of Alleged Incident and Year of Claim



13. The data showed that 316 claims of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne resulted in a monetary compensation payment (either from a civil claim or the Melbourne Response).
14. When the Melbourne Response was first established in 1996, compensation payments were capped at a maximum of \$50,000. In 2000, the maximum compensation was increased to \$55,000 and then was increased again in 2008 to \$75,000.

15. The total reported amount of compensation paid was \$12.8 million with an average payment per a claim or substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne of almost \$40,000 (either from a civil claim or the Melbourne Response). When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of \$16.8 million was paid to claimants at an average of around \$52,000 per claimant (either from a civil claim or the Melbourne Response).

Information pertaining to people who are the subject of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne

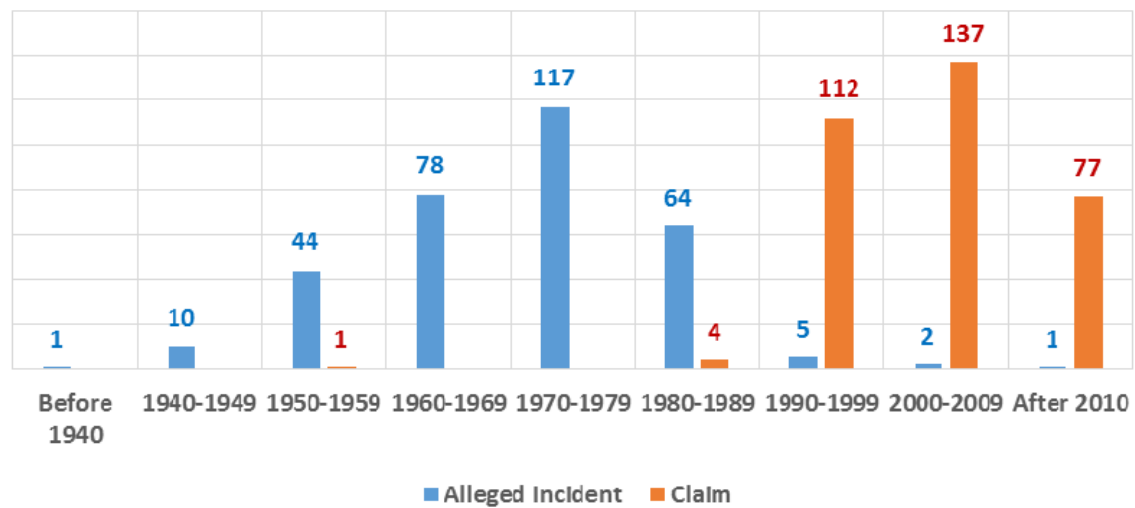
16. The data identified 188 people (priests, religious, employees or volunteers) subject to one or more claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne. On average, there were 2.5 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse per accused.
17. The data indicated that the gender of the accused in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne (where the gender is reported) was 92% male and 8% female.
18. The data indicated (where this information is reported) that 53% of the accused were priests, 16% were members of a religious order and 46% were employees or volunteers.
19. The data indicated (where this information is reported) that 75% of people subject to one or more claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne were alive at the time the first claim or substantiated complaint was made.

Information pertaining to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne where the accused is a priest

20. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed 335 people made either a claim of child sexual abuse, or a complaint of child sexual abuse that was substantiated, against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne.
21. Four of these claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne had more than one accused.
22. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim or were the subject of a substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne (where the gender is reported) was 77% male and 23% female. The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was 10 years old for females and 11 years old for males.
23. Where the age of the claimant or subject of the substantiated complaint is reported, 71% were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 29% were 13 years or older.
24. Ninety-four per cent of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne related to incidents alleged to have occurred from 1950 to 1989 (inclusive).

25. The decade with the highest number of alleged incidents of child sexual abuse where the accused is a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne was the 1970s (where the year of the first alleged incident was known), with 117 claims or 36% of the total claims or substantiated complaints relating to this time period.
26. The chart below shows the number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne by the year of the alleged incident and the year of claim (where relevant dates are known).

Year of Alleged Incident and Year of Claim



27. The data showed that of the 335 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne, 284 (or 85%) resulted in monetary compensation (either from a civil claim or a redress scheme).
28. The total reported amount of compensation paid was \$11.3 million with an average payment of almost \$40,000 per claim of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

29. Of the 335 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne, the data reported that 14 resulted in a civil claim (less than 5% of the total). Of those, four were discontinued, three are ongoing and seven resulted in monetary compensation.
30. In the civil claims that resulted in monetary compensation, the data reported that the total amount of compensation paid was \$1.7 million with an average of almost \$238,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of \$1.9 million was paid to claimants at an average of almost \$270,000 per claimant.
31. Of the 335 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne, the data reported that 93% went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, 1% were discontinued, 81% resulted in a monetary payment and 86% resulted in a payment for costs.
32. The data reported that 277 claims of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a reported total payment of \$9.7 million and an average of almost \$35,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of \$12.9 million was paid to claimants at an average of around \$46,000 per claimant.
33. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 101 claims of child sexual abuse against a priest in relation to

the Archdiocese of Melbourne resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. Of these, 38 identified prior knowledge as the reason for reduced indemnity.

34. The data identified 203 institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest.
35. Fifty-one institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne were subject to more than two claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against a priest.

Information pertaining to priests who are the subject of one or more claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne

37. The data identified 84 priests who are the subject of one or more claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne with an average of four claims or substantiated complaints per accused priest.
38. The data showed that the highest number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse relating to an individual priest was 56.
39. Seven accused priests were the subject of more than 10 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse – accounting for 54% of all claims or substantiated complaints.
40. The data indicated (where this information was reported) that 10% of the accused priests belonged to a religious order.
41. The data indicated (where this information was reported) that 89% of the accused priests were alive at the time the first claim or substantiated complaint was made.
42. The data indicated (where this information was reported) that 84% of priests subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne attended the Corpus Christi Seminary.

43. The table below shows the number of priests, claims and average claims per priest by seminary (where this information was reported).

44. The data identified that 16 of the 84 priests subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne were referred to the Congregation for the Clergy or the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. Referral of these priests occurred between 1977 and 2014: one in 1977, one in 1990, one in 2002, three in 2010, four in 2011 and six in 2014.
45. The data identified that 17 of the 84 priests subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne were the subject of one or more canonical applications (being either an application for dismissal from the priesthood or voluntary laicisation). The first canonical applications for these priests occurred between 1977 and 2014: one in 1977, one in 1990, one in 2002, three in 2010, five in 2011 and six in 2014.

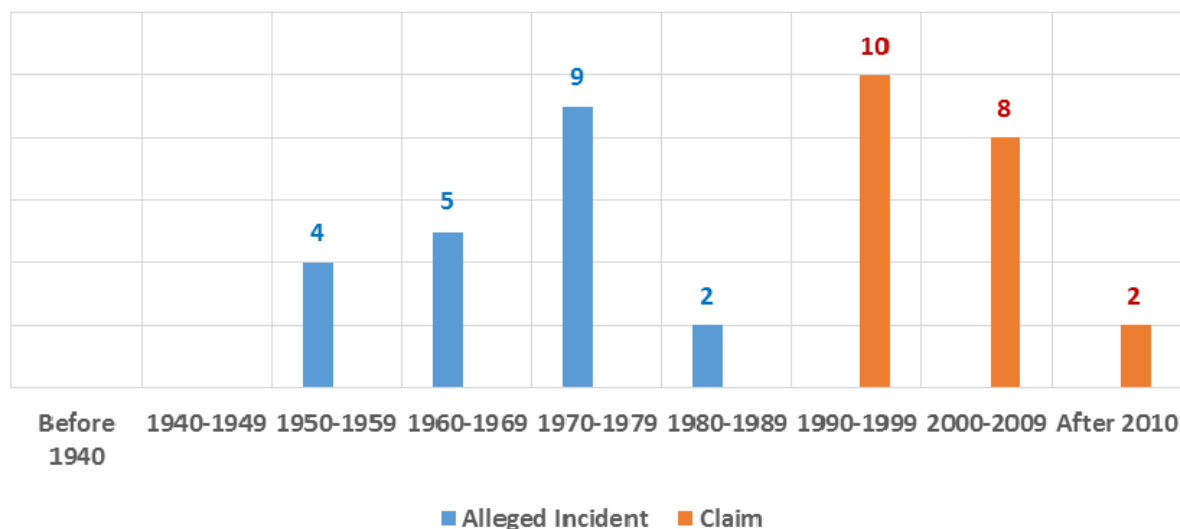
46. The data identified that of those priests subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne, two were the subject of more than one canonical application: one priest was subject to two applications and the other was subject to three applications.
47. The data showed that out of the total 17 priests who were subject to one or more canonical applications (where the outcome is known), 10 resulted in laicisation and five resulted in a penal precept.

Information pertaining to specific priests who are the subject of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne

Nazareno Fasciale

48. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 20 people made a claim of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale.
49. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale (where the gender is reported) was 70% male and 30% female. The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was eight years old for females and 10 years old for males.
50. In relation to Nazareno Fasciale (where the age of the claimant was known), 78% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 22% were 13 years or older.
51. The claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1953 to 1985 (inclusive).
52. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims of child sexual abuse pertaining to Nazareno Fasciale by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

53. The data identified 13 institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale. The table below shows the institutions involved by the year of the alleged incidents.

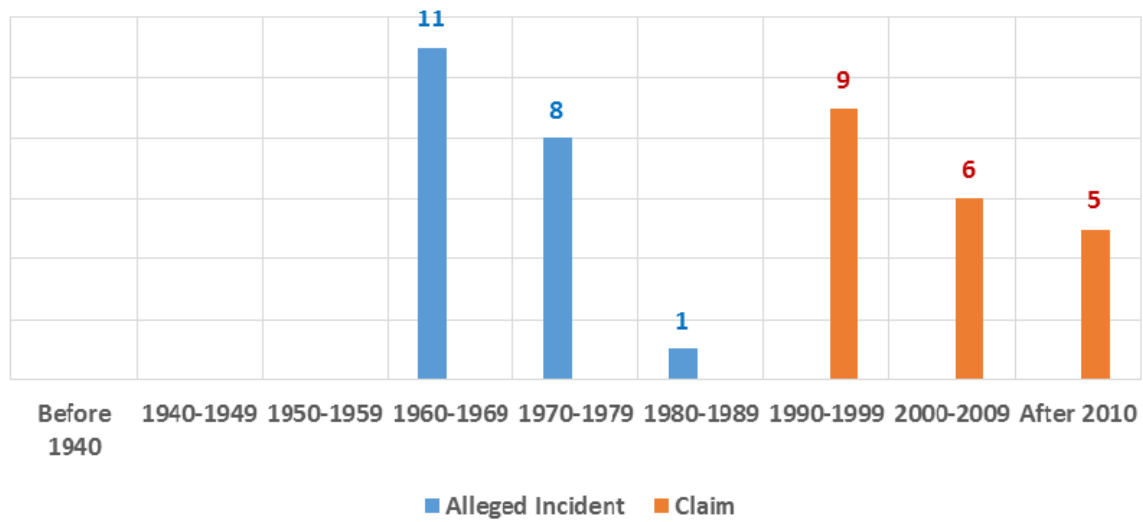
54. Of the 20 claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale, the data reported that none resulted in a civil claim.
55. Of the 20 claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale, the data reported that all went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, 19 resulted in monetary compensation and 12 resulted in a payment for costs.
56. The data reported that 19 claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$603,000 at an average of almost \$32,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$753,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$40,000 per claimant.
57. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 47% of claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. All of these claims (nine claims) had reduced indemnity due to prior knowledge. All claims involving prior knowledge (nine claims) resulted in nil indemnity.
58. The data indicated that Nazareno Fasciale:
 - a. Was born in 1926;
 - b. Died in 1996;
 - c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary in Melbourne and was ordained in 1952.
59. The data also showed that:

- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim against Nazareno Fasciale occurred one year after his ordination (he was 27 years old);
- b. Of the 20 claims of child sexual abuse against Nazareno Fasciale, three were made before his death;
- c. Nazareno Fasciale was not referred to the Congregation for Clergy or the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith;
- d. Nazareno Fasciale was placed on administrative leave in 1993; and
- e. Nazareno Fasciale was not the subject of a canonical application.

Wilfred Baker

60. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 21 people made either a claim of child sexual abuse, or a complaint of child sexual abuse that was substantiated, against Wilfred Baker.
61. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim or were the subject of a substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker (where the gender is reported) was 95% male (21 claimants) and 5% female (one claimant). The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was 12 years old for females and 11 years old for males.
62. In relation to Wilfred Baker (where the age of the claimant was known), 84% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 16% were 13 years or older.
63. The claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1960 to 1985 (inclusive).
64. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse pertaining to Wilfred Baker by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

65. The data identified 15 institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker. The table below shows the institutions involved by the year of the alleged incidents.

66. Of the 21 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker, the data reported that three resulted in a civil claim. Of those, none were discontinued, three resulted in monetary compensation payment and two resulted in a payment for costs.
67. The data reported that three civil claims of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker resulted in paid monetary compensation with a total payment of just over \$475,000 at an average of almost \$158,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$501,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$167,000 per claimant.
68. Of the 21 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker, the data reported that 18 went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, 16 resulted in a monetary compensation payment and nine resulted in a payment for costs.
69. The data reported that 16 claims of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$492,000 at an average of almost \$31,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$555,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$35,000 per claimant.
70. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 63% of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. Ten

claims had reduced indemnity due to prior knowledge. Of these, nine claims resulted in nil indemnity.

71. The data indicated that Wilfred Baker :
 - a. Was born in 1936;
 - b. Died in 2014;
 - c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary and was ordained in 1961.

72. The data also showed that:
 - a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim or substantiated complaint against Wilfred Baker occurred one year before his ordination (he was 24 years old);
 - b. Of the 21 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Wilfred Baker, 18 were made before his death;
 - c. Wilfred Baker was referred to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2010;
 - d. Wilfred Baker was placed on administrative leave in 1997; and
 - e. Wilfred Baker was the subject of a canonical application in 2010 and was laicised in 2012.

Ronald Pickering

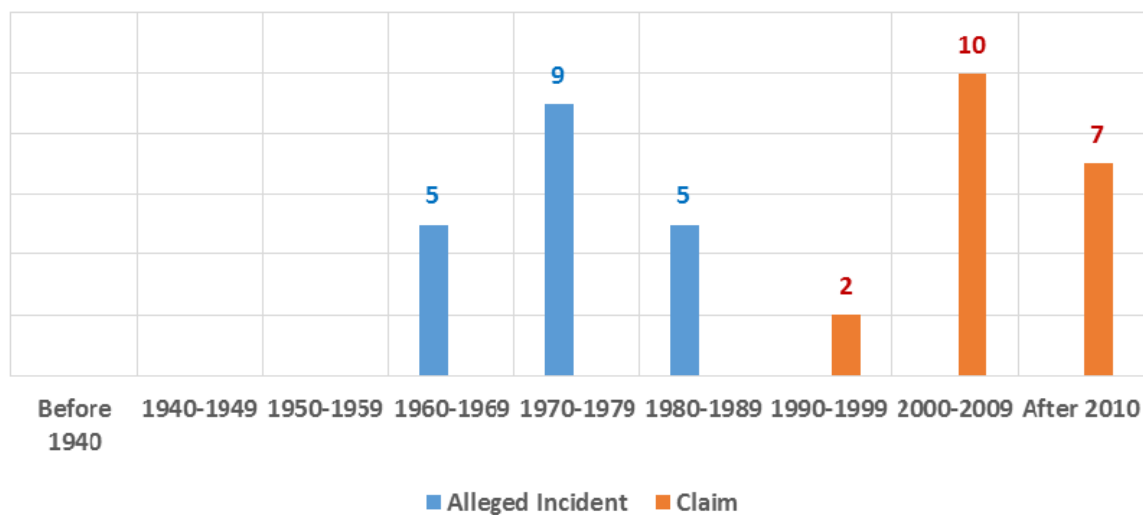
73. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 19 people made a claim of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering.

74. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering (where the gender is reported)

was 95% male (18 claimants) and 5% female (one claimant). The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was nine years old for females and 12 years old for males.

75. In relation to Ronald Pickering (where the age of the claimant was known), 79% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 21% were 13 years old or older.
76. The claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1960 to 1989 (inclusive).
77. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims of child sexual abuse pertaining to Ronald Pickering by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

78. The data identified 14 institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering. The table below shows the institutions involved by the year of the alleged incidents.

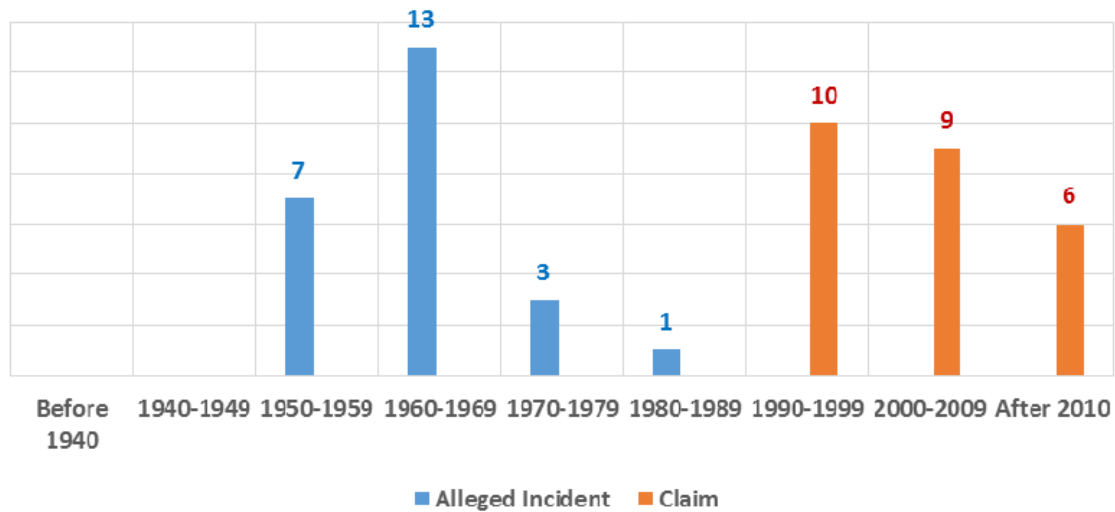
79. Of the 19 claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering, the data reported that none resulted in a civil claim.
80. Of the 19 claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering, the data reported that all went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, 16 resulted in a monetary compensation payment and 15 resulted in a payment for costs.
81. The data reported that 16 claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$593,000 at an average of just over \$37,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$881,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$55,000 per claimant.

82. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 19% of claims of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. No claims had reduced indemnity due to prior knowledge.
83. The data indicated that Ronald Pickering :
- a. Was born in 1927;
 - b. Died in 2009;
 - c. Attended the St Phillips Priory Seminary, Oxford, UK and then Corpus Christi Seminary in Melbourne. He was ordained in 1957.
84. The data also showed that:
- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim against Ronald Pickering occurred three years after his ordination (he was 33 years old);
 - b. Of the 19 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Ronald Pickering, 12 were made before his death;
 - c. Ronald Pickering was not referred to the Congregation for Clergy or the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith;
 - d. Ronald Pickering was not subject to a canonical application.

Desmond Gannon

85. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 25 people made a claim of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon.
86. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon (where the gender is reported) was 92% male (23 claimants) and 8% female (2 claimants). The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was eight years old for females and 11 years old for males.
87. In relation to Desmond Gannon (where the age of the claimant was known), 82% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 18% were 13 years or older.
88. The claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1954 to 1984 (inclusive).
89. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims of child sexual abuse pertaining to Desmond Gannon by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

90. The data identified 14 institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon. The table below shows the institutions involved by the year of the alleged incidents.

91. Of the 25 claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon, the data reported that none resulted in a civil claim.
92. Of the 25 claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon, the data reported that all went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, 22 resulted in a monetary compensation payment and 17 resulted in a payment for costs.
93. The data reported that 22 claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of almost \$730,000 at an average of just over \$33,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$848,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$39,000 per claimant.
94. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 14% of claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. No claims had reduced indemnity due to prior knowledge.
95. The data indicated that Desmond Gannon:
 - a. Was born in 1929;
 - b. Died in 2015;
 - c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary in Melbourne and was ordained in 1956.

96. The data also showed that:
- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim against Desmond Gannon occurred two years before his ordination (he was 25 years old);
 - b. Of the 25 claims of child sexual abuse against Desmond Gannon, 24 were made before his death;
 - c. Desmond Gannon was referred to Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2011;
 - d. Desmond Gannon received Encompass treatment in 1998;
 - e. Desmond Gannon was the subject of a canonical application in 2011 and was laicised in 2011.

Peter Searson

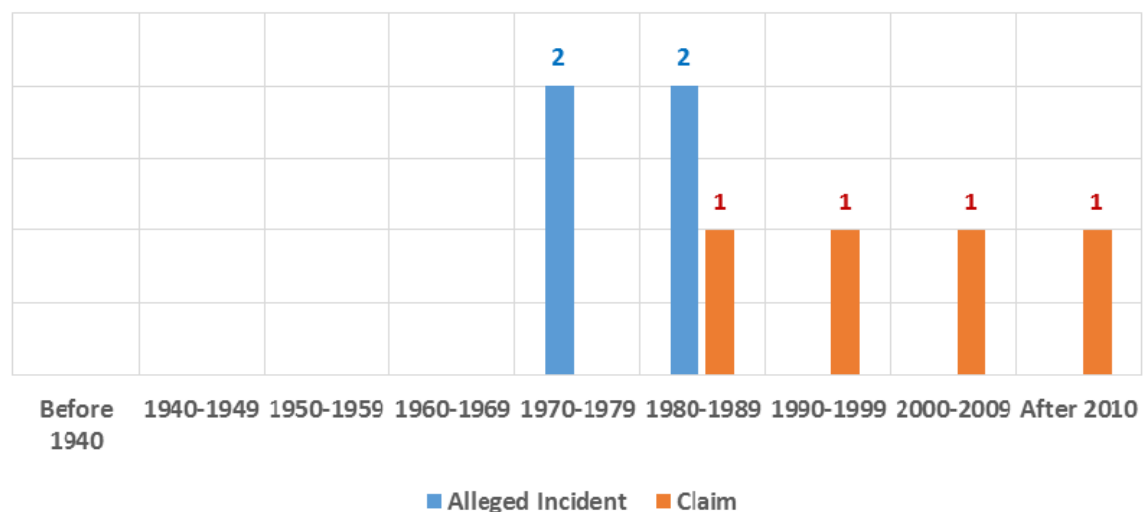
97. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that three people made a claim of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson. One person made a complaint of child sexual abuse that was substantiated, against Peter Searson.
98. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made either a claim or substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson (where the gender is reported) was 33% male and 67% female. The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was nine years old for females and 13 years old for males.

99. In relation to Peter Searson (where the age of the claimant was known), 67% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 33% were 13 years or older.

100. The claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1974 to 1985 (inclusive).

101. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse pertaining to Peter Searson by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

102. The data identified four institutions in relation to the Archdiocese of Melbourne that were subject to claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson. The table below shows the institutions involved by the year of the alleged incidents.

103. Of the three claims of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson, the data reported that none resulted in a civil claim.

104. Of the three claims against Peter Searson, the data reported that all claims went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, three resulted in monetary compensation payment and three resulted in a payment for costs.

105. The data reported that all three claims of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$162,000 at an average of just over \$54,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of just over \$291,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$97,000 per claimant.

106. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that one claim of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. No claims had reduced indemnity due to prior knowledge.

107. The data indicated that Peter Searson :

- a. Was born in 1923;
- b. Died in 2009;
- c. Peter Searson was placed on administrative leave in 1997; and
- d. Attended the Pontifical Beda College, Rome Seminary and was ordained in 1962.

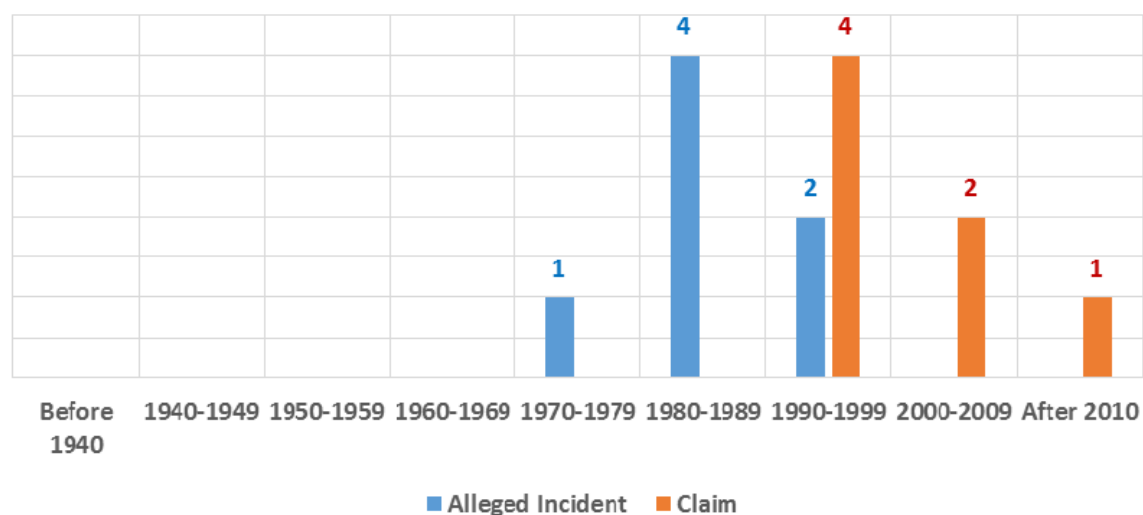
108. The data also showed that:

- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of claims or substantiated complaints against Peter Searson occurred 12 years after his ordination (he was 51 years old);
- b. Of the four claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against Peter Searson, three were made before his death;
- c. Peter Searson was not referred to the Congregation for Clergy or the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith; and
- d. Peter Searson was not the subject of a canonical application.

David Daniel

109. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that seven people made a claim of child sexual abuse against David Daniel.
110. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim of child sexual abuse against David Daniel (where the gender is reported) was 86% male (6 claimants) and 14% female (one claimant). The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was eight years old for females and 10 years old for males.
111. In relation to David Daniel (where the age of the claimant was known), 80% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 20% were 13 years or older.
112. The claims of child sexual abuse against David Daniel related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1972 to 1994 (inclusive).
113. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims of child sexual abuse pertaining to David Daniel by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

115. Of the seven claims of child sexual abuse against David Daniel, the data reported that one resulted in a civil claim. The claim resulted in a monetary compensation payment and a payment for costs.

116. The data reported that this civil claim of child sexual abuse against David Daniel resulted in paid civil compensation with a total payment of

\$70,000. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that the payment was \$100,000.

117. Of the seven claims of child sexual abuse against David Daniel, the data reported that six went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, six resulted in a monetary compensation payment and four resulted in a payment for costs.

118. The data reported that six claims of child sexual abuse against David Daniel resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$223,000 at an average of just over \$37,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of almost \$250,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$42,000 per claimant.

119. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that no claim of child sexual abuse against David Daniel resulted in nil or reduced indemnity.

120. The data indicated that David Daniel :

- a. Was born in 1942;
- b. Died in 2014;
- c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary and was ordained in 1975.

121. The data also showed that:

- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim against David Daniel occurred three years after his ordination (he was 30 years old);

- b. Of the seven claims of child sexual abuse against David Daniel, all were made before his death;
- c. David Daniel was referred to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2011;
- d. David Daniel was placed on administrative leave in 1997; and
- e. David Daniel was the subject of a canonical application in 2001 and was laicised in 2011.

Victor Rubeo

122. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that five people made a claim of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo.

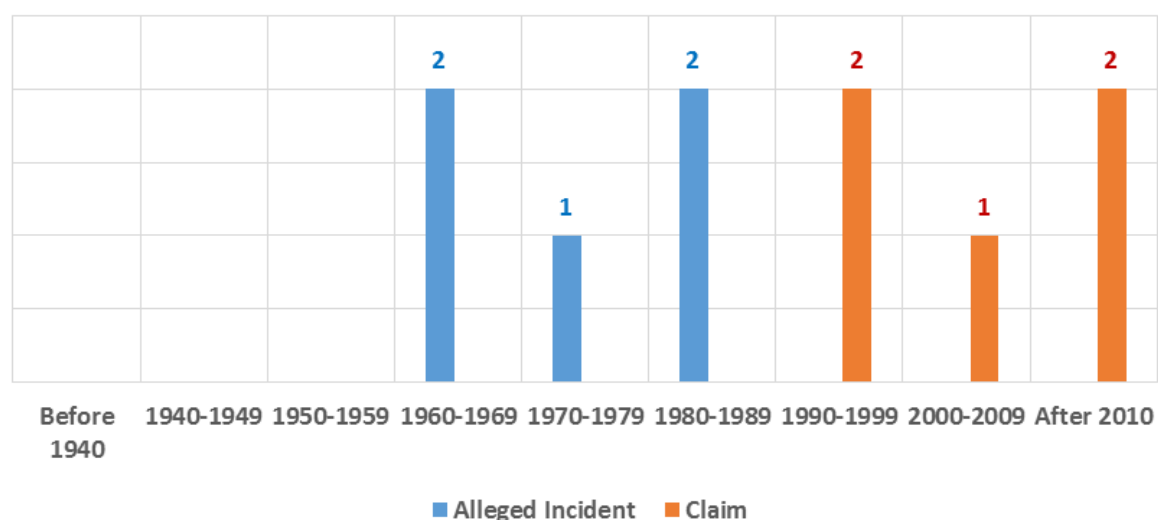
123. The data indicated that people who made a claim of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo (where the gender is reported) were all male. The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was 12 years old.

124. In relation to Victor Rubeo (where the age of the claimant was known), 75% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 25% were 13 years or older.

125. The claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1965 to 1985 (inclusive).

126. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims of child sexual abuse pertaining to Victor Rubeo by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

128. Of the five claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo, the data reported that none resulted in a civil claim.

129. Of the five claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo, the data reported that all went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, none were discontinued, four resulted in a monetary compensation payment and four resulted in a payment for costs.

130. The data reported that four claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of just over \$147,000 at an average of almost \$37,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of almost \$228,000 was paid to claimants at an average of around \$57,000 per claimant.

131. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that no claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo resulted in nil or reduced indemnity.

132. The data indicated that Victor Rubeo :

- a. Was born in 1933;
- b. Died in 2013;
- c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary and was ordained in 1959.

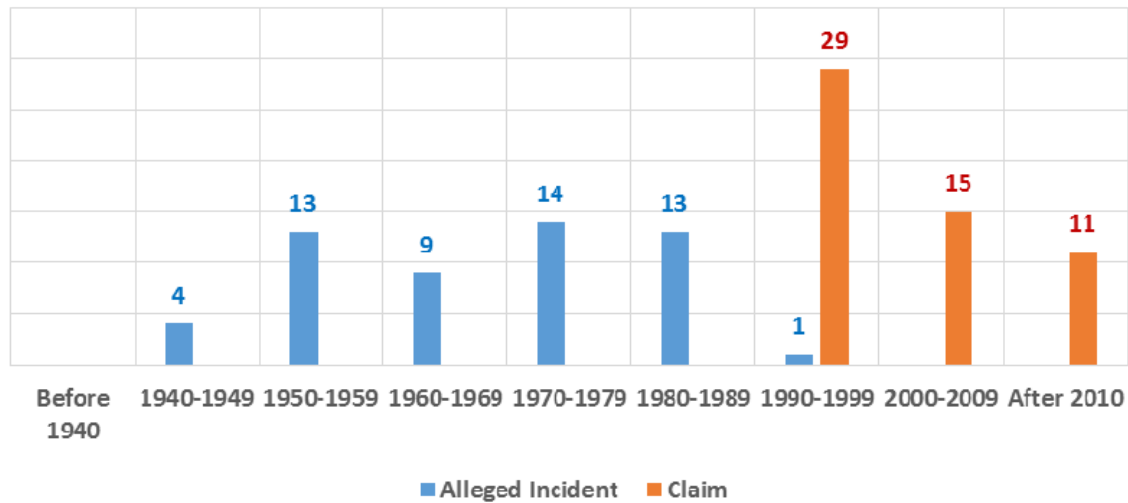
133. The data also showed that:

- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim against Victor Rubeo occurred six years after his ordination (he was 32 years old);
- b. Of the five claims of child sexual abuse against Victor Rubeo, four were made before his death;
- c. Victor Rubeo was referred to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in 2011; and
- d. Victor Rubeo was the subject of a canonical application in 2011 and nil outcome is reported in relation to the application.

John (Kevin) O'Donnell

134. The data produced to the Royal Commission revealed that 56 people made either a claim of child sexual abuse, or a complaint of child sexual abuse that was substantiated, against John (Kevin) O'Donnell.
135. The data indicated that the gender of the people who made a claim or were the subject of a substantiated complaint of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell (where the gender is reported) was 84% male (47 people) and 16% female (nine people). The average age of these children at the time of the alleged sexual abuse (where the age is reported) was 10 years old for females and 11 years old for males.
136. In relation to John (Kevin) O'Donnell (where the age of the claimant was known), 73% of the claimants were under the age of 13 years at the time of the alleged sexual abuse and 27% were 13 years or older.
137. The claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell related to alleged incidents that occurred in the period from 1944 to 1990 (inclusive).
138. The chart below shows the number of alleged incidents and the number of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse pertaining to John (Kevin) O'Donnell by date (where the pertinent dates are known).

140. Of the 56 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell, the data indicated that 22 related to institutions located in Oakleigh.

141. Of the 56 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell, the data reported that 10 resulted in a civil claim.

Of those, five were discontinued, two are ongoing, three resulted in a monetary compensation payment and two resulted in a payment for costs.

142. The data reported that three civil claims of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell resulted in paid civil compensation with a total payment of \$1.12 million at an average of almost just over \$373,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of almost \$1.29 million was paid to claimants at an average of around \$429,000 per claimant.
143. Of the 56 claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell, the data reported that 53 went through the Melbourne Response. Of those, three were discontinued, 49 resulted in a monetary compensation payment and 36 resulted in a payment for costs.
144. The data reported that 49 claims of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell resulted in paid compensation through the Melbourne Response with a total payment of almost \$1.51 million and an average of almost \$31,000 per claimant. When taking into consideration treatment, legal and other costs, the data reported that a total of almost \$1.94 million was paid to claimants at an average of around \$40,000 per claimant.
145. In terms of insurance (where this information was known), the data showed that 29% of claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell resulted in nil or reduced indemnity. The indemnity of 12 claims was partially reduced due to prior knowledge.
146. The data indicated that John (Kevin) O'Donnell :

- a. Was born in 1916;
- b. Died in 1997;
- c. Attended the Corpus Christi Seminary and was ordained in 1942.

147. The data also showed that:

- a. The first alleged incident of child sexual abuse the subject of a claim or substantiated complaint against John (Kevin) O'Donnell occurred two years after his ordination (he was 28 years old);
- b. All claims or substantiated complaints of child sexual abuse against John (Kevin) O'Donnell were made before his death;
- c. John (Kevin) O'Donnell was not referred to the Congregation for the Clergy or the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith;
- d. John (Kevin) O'Donnell was placed on administrative leave in 1993;
and
- e. John (Kevin) O'Donnell was not the subject of a canonical application.
