I am a Detective Senior Constable and have been seconded from Adelaide Criminal Investigation Branch to the Child Exploitation Investigation Section. I commenced compiling this declaration on Friday the 3rd of May 2002.

In 1993 I submitted a declaration dated 24th December. This declaration was in relation to enquiries I had conducted in August 1991 and September 1993. On the first page of this declaration I refer to the address as unit 19/93 Folkestone Road, Dover Gardens when in fact it should read unit 17/93 Folkestone Road, Dover Gardens. On page 3 of this declaration I refer to the 26th day of August 1993, when in fact it should read 26th day of August 1991.

At about 4.45 p.m. on Tuesday the 19th of March 2002, I was in company with Detective Senior Constable Farrington when we removed exhibits (1993) from the exhibit storage room located in the office of the Child Exploitation Investigation Section. Farrington and myself examined these exhibits and a property log was commenced. The exhibits were returned at 6.45 p.m. the same day.

At about 8 a.m. on Wednesday the 20th March 2002, I was in company with Detective Farrington when the same exhibits from 1993 were removed and further examined. The items were returned at 5 p.m. the same day.

On Friday the 22nd of March 2002, as a result of the arrest of the accused, I travelled to Bundaberg, Queensland in company with Detective Senior Constable Conte. At about 3.30 p.m. that date an application was made to the Bundaberg Magistrates Court for the extradition of Brian Bertram Morris Perkins to South Australia. Extradition and bail were not opposed and the defendant was remanded in custody in Bundaberg until his return to South Australia on Monday the 25th of March 2002.

An application was also made to the same magistrate for the execution of an extra-territorial search warrant authorising the search of Perkins premises at 4684 Goodwood Road, Bundaberg.

At about 4.20 p.m. that same day Detective Conte and myself attended at this address where Queensland detectives were already in attendance. Senior Constable Simon Obst from the Queensland police service was videotaping the interior and exterior of the premises. An independent Justice of the peace, Mr Nicholas Mahoney was also present. Detective Senior Constable Megan Owens was the designated exhibits officer. Other police present were Detective Senior Constables David Batt, Russell Williams and David Nixon and Senior Constable Paul Elliott. I saw Detective Senior Constable Conte seize the hard drive of the

computer and place the item in an anti-static bag. I observed a video tape recording of items seized as a result of the search.

At 5.30 p.m. that same day I was in company with Detective Conte, Detective Senior Constable Batt and Senior Constable Elliott when I attended at the Bundaberg Watch House where I spoke to Perkins. I cautioned Perkins and then advised him of the search of his premises and items seized. The conversation was recorded on audiotape.


At about 10 a.m. on the 26th of March 2002 I was in company with Detective Farrington when the 1993 exhibits were removed and further inspected. They were then returned at 4.30 p.m. that same day.

At about 2.50 p.m. on Wednesday the 3rd of April 2002, I was in company with Detective Farrington when we attended at unit **REDACTED**. At this location we spoke to a male occupant, **REDACTED**. He allowed us entry to his unit and the backyard. I was present whilst Detective Farrington took photographs of the back yard. I then obtained a statement from **REDACTED**.

At about 3.40 p.m. on Wednesday the 10th of April 2002, I was in company with Detective Conte, Karen Rogers from Parent Advocacy and **LH**. We drove to an area in the vicinity of the North Adelaide Aquatic Centre on the direction of **LH**. **LH** had indicated this was around the area he remembered that he travelled to get to 'Ted's' house. Detective Conte was operating a video camera.

We travelled past the aquatic centre and then travelled north along Prospect Road and drove past 203 Prospect Road but **LH** did not make a positive identification of the premises. At some stage I became aware that the battery on the video recorder had gone flat.

We continued travelling along Prospect Road, north of the intersection of Prospect and Regency Roads where I conducted a u-turn and then travelled south back past 203 Prospect

Road. Once again [LH] made no positive identification and I then pulled into the driveway of 203 Prospect Road.

On Monday the 15th of April 2002, at about 2.25 p.m. I conducted a videotaped record of interview with the victim, [LH]. The interview was conducted in the Sexual Assault video recording room on the first floor of Adelaide Police Station, 60 Wakefield Street, Adelaide. Present at this interview was Karen Rogers from Parent Advocacy Incorporated. The transcript of the interview is tendered as an exhibit and is marked as [LH] 1. The original video and audiotape are tendered as exhibits and marked as [LH] 2.

At about 10.10 a.m. on Tuesday the 23rd of April 2002 I re-attended at 203 Prospect Road in company with Detective Conte. On arrival we met with [LH], Karen Rogers and the landlord, Chris Marinis. Detective Conte was in possession of a video recorder and appeared to commence operating it. Shortly after I was notified that the battery had gone flat on the video recorder.

[LH] was shown through unit five and appeared to be trying to recall the premises. He did not make any particular comment to indicate that he knew these premises. After leaving the premises and whilst standing nearby he commented that he remembered the toilet out the back, the spare room and the entrance to the premises.

Later this same day I conducted a further interview with [LH] in the video recording room located at the Adelaide Police Station, 60 Wakefield Street, Adelaide. Karen Rogers from Parent Advocacy was also present. The transcript is tendered as an exhibit and is marked as [LH] 3 for identification. The original video recording and audiotape are tendered as exhibits and marked as [LH] 4.

On Monday the 6th of May 2002, I was in company with Detective Senior Constable Farrington where we travelled to Whyalla and at about 2p.m. this same day I obtained a


