I have perused the statements appended to the attached file as requested.

It is quite apparent on reading the original statements compiled by the Principal of the Willunga High School, Mr. C.B. SMITH, and more recently those obtained by Detective REDAC of the REDACTED REDAC, that there is a distinct pattern of what could be classed as unusual sexual behaviour on the part of Mr. Gregory KNIGHT, a teacher employed at the above mentioned School.

On reducing the statements to basic facts that may assist police in any prosecution, the following information is revealed.

1. REDACTED and REDACTED were the only students actually involved with what could be termed 'indecenties' with the teacher KNIGHT.
2. One of the students REDACTED did not wish to be further involved on the advice of his parents.
3. Incidents affecting the remaining three youths formed a pattern, but on each occasion there is no corroboration to substantiate what they alleged did happen.
4. Whilst it is highly unlikely there is a defence that the actions of the teacher KNIGHT was instructional (procedures for health and fitness camps) or accidental. (He did apologise to one youth, saying "I am sorry")
5. All of the youths involved are 13 years of age, and in my opinion their allegations need some corroboration.

At this stage of the proceedings KNIGHT has not been questioned by Detective Police to give his version of what occurred at the three camps mentioned. Prior to such arrangements being made, I would suggest the file be forwarded to REDACTED of the Crown Law Department for his opinion as to proceeding with any criminal charge, as it is my opinion that this matter should now be treated Departmentally by the Education Department.
