Dear Bishop John,

Thank you for your letter dated 25 th February. I welcome the news that my psychologist, Ms. Lynn O'Donoghue is to have her accounts paid.

I do recall that Dr. Adrian Farrelly offered ten sessions of counselling with a review of circumstances after that. However, at no stage was there any suggestion that I did not need regular counselling. On the contrary, I had indicated to Dr. Farrelly that I had received intensive counselling since 1994 with some psychiatric care prior to this. Further, an assessment last year by Dr. Donald Grant (copy sent to Thynne & McCartney) indicated there was a need for continued therapy (approximately 50 sessions)

I also wish to confirm that Dr. Farrelly, in front of a number of witnesses, stated that discussions regarding compensation would be ongoing. The specific details relating to compensation could not be finalised that day due to the fact that you, as Bishop, were not able to be there. Had this come to fruition, as promised, it would have provided me with the opportunity to pay for ongoing counselling myself.

I now look forward to confirmation from my psychologist, Ms. Lynn O'Donoghue that her outstanding account has been paid. Further, I am quite sure that she will be happy to submit a report to you regarding progress after the next counselling session.
