



# Child Protection Risk Management Analysis - High Risk Activities & Special Events

Activity	Description of Risks	Existing Control	Likelihood of Risk Occurring	Consequences	Level of Risk
HIGH RISK ACTIVITIES Events	Coach, volunteer, official, parent, spectator harming athlete	<p><b>Personnel</b></p> <p>→ SQ events have the following personnel in place to ensure thorough event and crowd control, including controlled access to and regular surveillance of high-risk areas - eg. toilets:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ SQ staff, including Event Coordinator</li> <li>✓ SQ volunteers</li> <li>✓ Sleeman Event Supervisor</li> <li>✓ Sleeman lifeguards</li> <li>✓ Sleeman duty staff</li> <li>✓ Sleeman roving security guards</li> <li>✓ One Sleeman usher per each level of grandstands</li> </ul> <p>At the direction of SQ, all the above personnel exercise vigilance regarding the welfare of children and must report any suspicions or risk of harm to the SQ Events Coordinator.</p> <p><b>Restricted Access</b></p> <p>→ Restricted access signage is posted in all prohibited areas</p> <p>→ Access to pool deck and adjoining rooms is out of bounds to general spectators</p> <p>→ Automatic doors leading on to pool deck are set to auto exit only from pool deck</p> <p><b>Supervision</b></p> <p>Children who volunteer at SQ meets - eg. Results Runners or Basket Handlers are under the supervision of SQ staff or SQ volunteers</p>	Rare	Major	Moderate

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<b>HIGH RISK ACTIVITIES Events (continued)</b>	Child being abducted from front gate after the completion of his/her competition whilst waiting to be picked up by parent	Front gate volunteers and event staff (SQ and Sleeman) to monitor children waiting to be picked up from the venue	Rare	Major	Moderate
