Glossary of Terms Used in the Statement of Richard Strickland

Catholic school – a non-government school regulated by the Catholic Education Office of WA in accordance with the Minister’s system agreement with the Catholic Education Commission of WA (a term of administrative convenience)

Government school – a school established by the Minister for Education under section 55 of the *School Education Act 1999*

Independent public school - a government school that operates with a high level of autonomy

Independent school – a non-government school operating outside the Minister’s system agreement with the Catholic Education Office of WA (a term of administrative convenience)

Non-government school – a school required to be registered in accordance with section 154 of the *School Education Act 1999*

School registration – registration in accordance with Part 4 of the *School Education Act 1999*

School registration standards – standards determined by the Minister for Education in accordance with section 159 of the *School Education Act 1999*

SEAct - *School Education Act 1999* which came into force on 1 January 2001

SERegulations – *School Education Regulations 2000*

System agreement – an agreement between the Minister and the Catholic Education Commission of WA in accordance with section 169 of the *School Education Act 1999*

Teacher registration – registration in accordance with Part 3 of the *Teacher Registration Act 2012*

TRA – *Teacher Registration Act 2012* which came into force on 7 December 2012

TR(Accreditation)Regulations – *Teacher Registration (Accreditation of Initial Teacher Education Programmes) Regulations 2012*

TR(General)Regulations – *Teacher Registration (General) Regulations 2012*

TRBWA - Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia, established by section 86 of the *Teacher Registration Act 2012*

WACOT - Western Australian College of Teaching established by section 5 of the *Western Australian College of Teaching Act 2004*

WACOT Act – *Western Australian College of Teaching Act 2004* which came into force on 15 September 2004

WWCC – Working with Children Check under the *Working with Children (Criminal Record Checking) Act 2004*
